Thank you for your Official Information Act 1982 (OIA) request of 23 September 2024, to the Ministry of Disabled People - Whaikaha (the Ministry) seeking information relating to the My Home My Choice programme.

We believe the documentation that will be released to you next week will provide you with the information you are seeking, however after reading you are welcome to make a more refined request for internal correspondence.

You will be provided copies of advice provided to the Minister for Disability Issues. No advice or correspondence from other external parties or researchers has been identified as in scope.
