



As we know, you apologised for lighting the museum up in the colours of the Israeli flag immediately after the brutal massacre and torture of 1,400 Israelis and the taking hostage of hundreds more, saying you appreciated the depth of feeling on the issues and you apologised for the distress and hurt caused. As you know the Holocaust Centre of New Zealand, like the Jewish community, was appalled at the insensitivity of that statement and your inability to stand beside a minority group that had suffered the largest slaying of Jews since the Holocaust.

Last night, you allowed the museum to be lit in the colours of the Palestinian flag, again succumbing to those who push a single, simplistic narrative. In an atmosphere that has seen a staggering increase in antisemitism, the Jewish community, and many others, are again left to wonder if the museum has an agenda that is complicit with those who seek to harm Jews. We are aware of course that you did not light up the building, but neither did you provide any security to prevent it from happening. Will you apologise for letting your institution be used in this manner?

On behalf of the student representatives and staff of Te Tira Ahu Pae, I would like to apologise for the distress caused over the social media posts that took the stance of siding with Palestine and used the inflammatory language of Free Palestine – from the river to the sea.

The team and I have taken the time to review the position and process taken in making this statement and have agreed that a full consultation with the whole student body was not undertaken and that research was not carried out to the wording of our post.

The student representatives had pressure from a vocal group of students to take this stance, however in review, we have concluded that we lack a thorough policy and process for such statements. The decision to make this statement was made by the collective of student representatives with the support of a group of students, however we now acknowledge this process was unfair, biased and rushed. We have removed these posts and will not be making any further public comments on the conflict in Israel and Gaza.

We acknowledge that many students, alumni and community members have been impacted due to said conflict and as a student association that represents all students at Massey University, we need to ensure a safe, inclusive space for all students. We are sorry that we let you and many other students down with our statement by not demonstrating sensitivity to the diversity of the university community.

Te Tira Ahu Pae will be holding a full training with all newly elected and appointed student representatives before the start of semester 1, 2024, and will be ensuring that it is made very dear, that commenting, campaigning or aligning ourselves with any political, humanitarian, social or any other type of position can only be taken with thorough consultation of all students and consultation about such things must take place in a safe and inclusive manner. We will also be much more thorough in ensuring that the language that we use if we ever should take a position is not inflammatory, prejudiced or discriminatory.

Dear David,

It is now over two months since Deborah Hart and I met with Professor Richard Bedford and Alastair Carruthers. In that meeting, we had a frank discussion about the Museum's apology for lighting up on 15 October last year in solidarity with the victims of the deadliest day for the Jewish people since the Holocaust, and the distress the Jewish community suffered from both that apology and the Museum's subsequent handling of the situation on 7 November.

We also expressed the hope that we could find a constructive way to repair our relationship and rehabilitate the Museum as an inclusive and welcoming space for our community, **and structure s**.7(2)(1) and left the matter with Richard and Alastair to progress. We are yet to hear further from you or them on this.

In the meantime, we note that, as Richard suggested, the New Zealand Holocaust Centre has made a submission on the draft annual plan, which we endorse.

However, it has come to our attention that several Museum staff members are wearing badges or pins of the Palestinian flag. It is of course an internal matter for you to determine whether it aligns with your policies to have front-facing staff making political statements through items of adornment. However, if you were indeed hoping to rehabilitate the Museum as an inclusive and welcoming space for the Jewish community, we suggest to you that allowing the Palestinian flag to be displayed in this way is unlikely to achieve that. The simple but sad fact is that, in the current climate, for many Jewish people that flag is associated with hostility, if not violence. We all hope that one day that will not be the case, and we will look upon it differently, but that is not today.

We would like to understand if this practice is endorsed by the Museum, in which case we will advise our community members accordingly. We would also like to know when we can expect to hear back from the Museum on what steps it will take towards a conciliation with our community.





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

Thank you for your letter dated 1 July 2024. Let me reassure you that despite an absence of follow-up by me personally to our meeting last December, the Trust Board and the Chief Executive of the Museum remain very committed to rebuilding our relationship with the Jewish community.

In your letter you make reference to the fact that we have not acknowledged your submission to the Museum's Draft Annual Plan. We have conducted a search of our systems but have been unable to find a submission from you or the Holocaust Centre of New Zealand. We have also checked all email addresses and web links that are likely to have received submissions, including anonymous ones, and have not been able to identify a submission that might have been from you.

We are not sure why this is, and it is concerning that you have sent us a submission which appears not to have arrived. We are about to commence our next cycle of annual planning meetings and I would be very grateful if you could please re-send your submission directly to me by email so that the Board can take into consideration the Centre's views on the Museum's plans for 2024/25 and beyond.

We acknowledge and deeply regret the distress and hurt experienced by members and supporters of the Jewish community in the absence of any public response by the Museum to the lighting up of the Museum by protesters on 7 November 2023. We were alerted to the planned protest action in the afternoon of that day, and we increased security personnel as well as liaising with the New Zealand Police to ensure the security of the building, public visitors and staff that evening. In hindsight, we should have contacted you also at this time.

Since that protest action on 7 November, the Museum has invested in modifying its lighting systems, so it is now possible to turn off the up-lights in the event of unauthorised interference and to use newlyinstalled Boodlights for the necessary security illumination and visibility. The Board has also adopted a special lighting policy to ensure that decisions to light the exterior of the Museum are aligned with our values and vision, including our civic role as a provincial War Memorial.

I remain committed to our relationship with you and the Jewish community and if you feel a phone conversation with David and me about how we might move forward with some constructive action in this regard would be useful, please let me know.
