How long have the 4 traffic cameras listed below in Christchurch been offline? And what is the cause? And what is the timeframe to fix them?

Surely this is a traffic management risk and a waste of taxpayer money by not having them operating.

- QEII / Main North Road intersection
- Memorial Ave / Airport bridge heading south
- Riccarton Road / Clyde Road intersection
- Marshland Road / Prestons Road heading south

Camera name	Offline since	Comments
Marshland Road / Prestons Road South	26/01/2024 3:26	This is a Christchurch City Council camera and has been replaced with a different model and will be removed from NZ Transport Agency Waka Kotahi (NZTA) website as this is no longer serving as a webcam.
Riccarton Road / Clyde Road	17/01/2024 20:15	This is a Christchurch City Council camera and has been replaced with a different model and will be removed from NZTA's website as this is no longer serving as a webcam.
SH1 Memorial Avenue South	12/12/2023 9:48	This camera is faulty and has been highlighted to the NZTA asset management team. It will be replaced in early 2025.
SH74 Queen Elizabeth II Drive	24/04/2024 15:15	This camera has been recently replaced and is the process of being re-configured to deliver the snapshots to the NZTA website. No firm timeframe but anticipated operational by end of January 2025.

Please note that while the online journey planner's web cameras are not operational, our separate traffic management cameras at the above locations are still functioning.
