Purpose of Report

Hamilton, written to the Region.
The letter is attached. It is proposed that you authorise the Board of Trustees of Te Rapa School, Hamilton (2020) to open on Saturday 25 March 2006. Te Rapa School have written to the Regional Manager, Ministry of Education, requesting this approval.

Background/Analysis/Ministry Comment

- The school is celebrating its centenary and as part of the celebration has planned 2. formal lessons and a full school production performance on this Saturday. (Refer letter attached).
- 3. All children and teachers are expected to attend to allow visitors to see the school in action.
- From 1906 to 1997 the school was located on a site adjacent to the former Royal 4. New Zealand Air Force base at Te Rapa. The school was moved into modern buildings on its present site in Oqober 1997. Most former students attending the centennial will not have seen the hewschool.
- With effect from 2006, boards of trustees no longer have the delegated authority to open the schools they administer on a Saturday or Sunday.
- The Ministry of Education supports this application. It is planned as an open day 6. for the benefit of visitors with children and teachers participating in the usual range of school activities including classroom learning,

Legislative Provision



Section 65D(2) of the Education Act 1989 ("the Act") states that the Minister of Education may authorise a Board to open and close any school it administers in accordance with terms and holidays (specified by the Minister) that affer from those otherwise required by this Act to be observed; and, subject to any terms and conditions specified by the minister when giving the authority, schools may be open and closed accordingly.

Request for Ministerial Approval to Extend Times to be Open For Instruction

In 1999 the Hon. Dr Nick Smith (Minister of Education) granted Hagley Community College ministerial approval to operate an 'extended school day' from 8am - 9pm, Monday to Friday to deliver secondary education programmes to our large and diverse community. (letter attached).

This has been very successful and in 2010 there will be over 50 programmes operating during this time with provision to increase this in 2011. We have extended our day to meet the needs of our learning community by providing greater learning opportunities while at the same time being fiscally responsible by maximising our college facilities and resources. The support and insight of the Minister (Nick Smith) was invaluable.

The extension of our school day has had a significant positive impact upon student engagement and student achievement for students of all ages and ethnicities. The college would like to build on this success by further increasing our flexibility to deliver new learning opportunities for students over the age of 16. I have enclosed a copy of our Annual Performance Report 2009 (Sections A - E).

On behalf of the Hagley Community College Board of Trustees I would like to formally request ministerial approval for a further extension so that the college can deliver 'block' courses on weekends and during traditional term breaks. Already the college has requests by interested students to run qualification based programmes around pre-nursing, early childhood, etc. Other examples of programmes where a block of time is desirable: hospitality, media and technology.

The college is very mindful of the regulations relating to the number of half days a school is required to be open for instruction. We do not wish to compromise those regulations in any way and therefore propose that any extension granted to our 'times of operation' will not be included in the calculation for the requirement to be 'open for instruction'.

The basis for our application is to increase the learning opportunities for our diverse senior student population; to increase the flexibility of when they can effectively engage with the college to under take further study at the secondary level; and to maximise the use of our school's facilities and resources. The outcomes we are seeking from these opportunities are to improve student success in education and to provide effective education pathways for their on-going learning and employment.

We look forward to four consideration of our request. We are optimistic for a positive response to our application for ministerial approval of a further extension of the times we are able to be open for instruction to include weekend and term holidays.

Dear Brent Ingram

Thank you for your letter of 25 June 2009 requesting my approval of your proposal to extend Hagley Community College's opening hours to accommodate the running of block courses in weekends.

I have no concerns about your proposal. In fact, my approval is not required provided that all students under the age of 16 attend school full time whenever the school is open for instruction, (i.e. during normal school hours).

I am confident that you have a clear understanding that senior students aged 16 and over may be allowed by school management to attend school part-time or on a varied time-table that involves only part-time attendance during normal school hours. However, all students are entitled to attend school whenever it is open for instruction. Therefore, any programme that involves attendance outside normal school hours, including weekends or during holidays, is an optional choice for senior students.

Also, I am sure that you are aware that your Board may only charge fees to students other than adult students, to attend classes at the school as long as they are usually held outside normal school hours and are open to people not enrolled full-time at the school.

I applaud Hagley Community College's willingness to be flexible and responsive in its efforts to meet the wide-ranging educational needs of its students.
