



LOCAL GOVERNMENT ON THE WEST COAST INTO THE FUTURE

We have finalised our Draft Long Term Plan and I am more convinced than ever before that challenges facing local communities in the form of the cost of compliance with Drinking Water Standards, the cost of the Emissions Trading Scheme and the cost of bringing all buildings to an earthquake compliant level to name but a few, will make local governance as we know it near unaffordable over the medium to long term.

More recent statements by the Prime Minister show that local government is "ripe for reform". I expect the Auckland model of legislated amalgamations to be applied throughout the country. I do know for a fact that the Minister for Local Government is looking at opportunities for amalgamation on the West Coast, Having four local authorities for a total community of less than 35,000 people is difficult to justify amidst ever rising financial demands on our communities.

My view is that the Coast should follow the example set by Greater Wellington and develop a local solution that will deliver efficiencies that will translate into cost and other savings as a means of avoiding an external solution being forced upon us. My personal view is that three Unitary Councils have to be created but this is one of a number of potential options that we can look at. The purpose of this letter is not to debate the form the Governance structure should take. The purpose is rather to secure your involvement in an in-depth discussion on the issue at the next Mayors and Chair meeting and for that meeting to perhaps set in place an action plan to develop a local solution. The key here is that we determine our own destiny as a means of avoiding a solution being forced upon us.

On that basis, I ask that this issue be placed on the next agenda.
