Dear Dr Wilson,

I am responding on behalf of the University to your request for information made under the Official Information Act 1982. The information you have asked for is:

- 1. Of your graduates, how many found gainful employment as veterinarians in each of the last five calendar years?
- 2. Of your graduates, how long on average do they remain in the veterinary industry?
- 3. What is the prevalence of mental illness among your veterinary undergraduates, compared to the mental illness of a similar cohort of non veterinary students?
- 4. How many of your graduates or students have committed or are suspected to have committed suicide since the year 2000?
- 5. Do you agree that the world has now for some time been in a state of severe oversupply of Western-trained veterinarians?

A response to each of your requests above is as follows:


