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ORGAN & TISSUE DONATION

RATIONALE

To ensure there is a standardised approach to discussing and facilitating organ and tissue donation in compliance with Organ Donation New Zealand (ODNZ) guidelines.

SCOPE

Northland District Health Board Departments

KEYWORDS

Organ and Tissue donation Donation after cardiac death (DCD)

DEFINITIONS

ORGAN DONATION

- Can only occur after brain death, (diagnosed as per ODNZ guidelines) Death must occur while the patient is connected to a ventilator.
- Haemodynamic parameters are supported in the ICU to ensure tissue perfusion is maintained.
- Ventilation and haemodynamic support is continued until all consented organs and tissues are removed in the operating theatre.
- Organs that can be donated include: heart or heart valves, lungs, liver, pancreas, kidneys and eyes (corneas and sclera)

TISSUE DONATION

- Tissue can be donated post death. Death can occur outside ICU.
- Tissue that can be donated include : heart valves and eyes (corneas and sclera.)

DONATION AFTER CARDIAC DEATH

- Currently in Whangarei Hospital organ donation is confined to organ and tissue donation as listed above.
- In the future organ donation may also be possible after death has been determined on the basis of cessation of circulation i.e. organ donation after cardiac death.
- In this instance cessation of circulation, declaration of death and removal of consented organs must all occur within the post extubation hour

STANDARD / METHOD

ORGAN DONATION

- All potential organ donors are discussed with the ICU consultant on duty BEFORE any discussion occurs with the family.
- All organ donation discussions with the family MUST involve the ICU consultant on duty and must occur in a private, secure area (not in front of the patient).
- All potential organ donors must be admitted into ICU for maintenance and support of haemodynamic function.
- All brain death tests to be performed by the ICU consultant and a second physician familiar with the brain death test process.
- ODNZ guidelines to be followed as per ODNZ guidelines (located in ICU).
