

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Overview

This document is to identify the preferred method to integrate the NCEA PAL system with NZQA system. Here we will consider industry best practices and security measures.

NCEA's Understanding

NCEA PAL understand that NZQA is concern about the student NSN number and its password and require the app users to always enter their credentials to the system to gain access to the NZQA system.

Also NCEA PAL understands that we are not in a position to store any of the credential data in the application and only store the student record details.

Possible Integration Approaches

Method 1: OAuth 2.0 to Access NZQA data

Considering all the above requirements by NZQA we feel that it this is the best approach to connect and get the student records. This will be very similar to other OAuth solutions in the market where the User of NCEA PAL can enter their credentials to login to NZQA system, by doing that the system will ask if they would like to grant NCEA PAL to access their student records. If they grant the permission the system will go and download their student records via a RESTful API call.

Similar systems of this nature are:

- 1. Facebook Graph API
- 2. Google Developer OAuth 2.0 API

We do understand that these solutions are relatively difficult to develop and WZOA still be in the process of getting it done.

Method 2: AES Encryption on Sensitive data along the wire [Recommended]

When a user request for the student records we will encrypt using an AES encryption mechanism and transfer that data to the NZQA system. Here the system will decrypt the data and send the relevant student records as a RESTFul web service. NCEA will only know the encryption cipher where as NZQA will only know the decryption. This is done for security issues. All Web sevices will transfer data via SSL photocol.

We believe this is the most efficient method and easy to implement.

Method 3: NZQA web page and post data

NZQA will create a HTML5 page that allow the users to connect via the APP. Our NCEA Pal allocation will open up the page and allow the user to login. When they click on the download student records it will start active the download function asynchronously. Moment the data is ready it will notify NCEA system to download the data. For the NCEA user feel a delay as it needs to run on a schedule manner.

Thank you for your paper with alternative proposals for access to student achievement data from NZQA. It was good to meet with you and Jeff in January and to discuss data accuracy and the security limitations of accessing the personal (achievement) data held by NZQA for students undertaking NCEA.

Background

As we noted when we met, schools begin to give NZQA initial student achievement and unit standard entry data in April of each year. Entries are provisional up until December of each year. The accuracy and completeness of entry data is very poor until about July of each year.

During the year, each month at a minimum, schools send files of entries, and of any results (internally assessed) for those entries. Both the entries and results are captured on students School Result Summaries with results (once fees have been paid) being added to students Records of Achievement. Results for externally assessed standards are added but embargoed and made visible after qualifications are checked, awarded and results released in the middle of January.

Original proposal

Your first proposal to us involved students downloading their Record of Achievement pdf so that the data in it could be 'scraped' and entered into the application. The application on their phone would then save the individual user name and password and automatically and frequently request updated data from NZOA without the student requesting it or logging into NZQA to access it

NZQA proposa

We advised that the School Result Summary contained better data for this purpose as it holds results whether the student has paid fees or not and it holds entries in standards that have yet to have results captured. However, we suggested that to overcome the issues with security and privacy the student request updated data themselves. You agreed to consider this.

Response

น์ที่ response you note that you want your application to be able to be used from phones and not to require students to have to use desk-tops to load the data - we understand and agree. You also say that the capturing and scraping data from pdfs on phones is not viable as some phones do not enable pdfs to be stored. I checked into this and am pleased to be able to say that this is not the case.

advises me that while users of iOS devices do not have direct access to the file 4(2)(a) systems individual iOS application are assigned with their own data container. An iOS application's interactions with the file system are limited mostly to the directories inside the applications sandbox.

Alternative proposals

Your proposed method 1 is now very similar to your original proposal and still does not address our privacy and security concerns. You suggest that the application (through an intermediary tool) will use the student user name and password instead of the student doing

so themselves. While you note that you intend to encrypt NSN numbers¹ and passwords so that they will not be readable this does not address our privacy and security concerns.

Your proposed **method 2** does have students accessing their records themselves. However, you state that many Apple devices do not allow the storage on pdfs on the local hard drive. Therefore you want the students to be able to download their records to your servers. This again raises our privacy and security concerns.

However, as pdfs can be loaded onto phones (including iOS based ones) there is no need to for the students records to be moved to your servers (or for NZQA to make changes to the student login page for this to occur). This brings us back to our original suggestion.

Way forward

We do understand that this is not the best alternative and that an API (application programme interface) is. We have started scoping the development of a generic API which you (and others) could use. We have this on our work programme but I am unable to say if we will get it delivered by the end of this year. We should have a timeline within a couple of months once our proposal has been scoped, costed and gone through our approval process:

NZQA has also developed a NCEA application but we have not attempted to use student records to populate it – for all the reasons previously discussed. It is likely that we will make use of the API once it is developed.

¹ Just a quick clarification – student's access their results and entries via their student login page on the NZQA website. Access requires a user name and a password. The user name can be anything the student wishes it to be. Some use NSNs but not all user names are NSNs and it is likely that we will move away from allowing the use of NSNs over time.
