With the audit ongoing and potential escalation around this, I've asked Kelly not to attend this meeting. Our focus need to be on finalising the audit result which is still some way off (and looking likely to be a substantial recovery). He may have taken offence that Kelly and Caroline came in and removed the records required for audit. It is quite common for services to question the audit process when the substantive issues that we find at audit are significant.

Any questions they may have around the audit process or "protocol" can be directed to me, although I'm happy for you to refer to the following if it helps:

- We have not differed from the audit process outlined in the funding handbook, in our visit letter, and in the ECA cover letter.
- Following written notification of the audit, we extended the timeframe and they were given another week to have these records ready.
- It is common for auditors to collect records and take them off-site for the purposes of an audit, particularly when a service is literally based in someone's home and does not have an office for auditors to work from.
- We are authorised by the Secretary of Education to enter and inspect schools and ECE services under sections 78A and 319B of the Education Act 1989. This authority allows us to:
  - o Enter and inspect any licensed early childhood education and care services;
  - Inspect, photocopy, print out or copy onto disk (whether held in electronic or paper form) that the person believes on reasonable grounds to belong to the licensed service;
  - o Remove any documents in its original form or an electronic or paper copy.

I left two voice mail messages yesterday, one on your landline and the other on your mobile phone concerning the decision to place our milestone 4 payment on hold pending the outcome of the audit.

We had thought this had been a condition placed by the Resourcing Auditors but in discussing with them they advised that this was not them and to go back to you concerning this decision.

This seems both severe and sudden - especially without any discussion or consultation

In addition to this we had also highlighted the urgency in receiving this payment before the 23 May, of which you had indicated that the payment would be made late this week.

I have also been unable to find any condition within our contracted arrangement that allows the payment to be placed on hold in relation to the pending outcome of an audit — of which you bought to our attention yesterday as the reasoning for the delay:

# Outcome Agreement between the Ministry of Education and Aoga I Maota Charitable Trust

#### 8 Payment

8.1 Subject to the Purchasing Agency's rights under clause 13.1 to 13.3 of the Framework Terms and Conditions (Recovery, Reduction or Suspension of Payments), the Purchasing Agency will pay the Provider the amounts specified for the Service, at the times and subject to any pre-conditions set out in Appendix 5.

Pre-conditions to receiving payment

- (a) the Service Provider has notified the Ministry in writing that the relevant Project milestone has been completed; and
- (b) the Service Provider has provided the Ministry with GST invoices for all goods and services purchased to complete the relevant Project milestone; and
- (c) the Ministry is satisfied, either by inspecting the completed work, by receipt of the relevant invoices, or by some other means, that the Project milestone is completed in accordance with Schedule 2.

- (II) satisfying any conditions that can result in the Purchasing Agency suspending or terminating the Services under an Outcome Agreement, the Purchasing Agency may:
- (b) require the Provider to:
- (I) repay a portion of funding already paid to the Provider; or
- (ii) reduce the amount to be pald on subsequent payment dates; or
- (c) suspend or delay payment of a portion of the amount to be paid on subsequent payment dates until a Remedy Plan is agreed and its obligations are performed.

13.2 Any amount to be repaid, reduced, suspended or delayed pursuant to clause 13.1 or 12.3(c) will be determined by the Purchasing Agency acting reasonably and following a discussion with the Provider regarding the quality and quantity of Services that were provided or the circumstances relevant to the suspension or delay in payment.

13.3 The Provider must repay the Purchasing Agency within 30 days of the date the Purchasing Agency provides written notice of the amount to be repaid to the Provider.

Earlier yesterday afternoon we met with the Resourcing Auditors who indicated that our audit would be complete today of which they would contact us to provide additional feedback/information.

Please note her query is regarding TAP 3 funding not operational funding.

However please note that their recently completed audit has resulted in a recovery of over \$111,000.00 for 3 of their services. This is significant recovery.

They are a serious risk to the crown at present and we have been dealing with a large number of issues concerning this service provider over the last quarter, this is the service provider that we did the special calculation for last funding round when we placed them on monthly to help them clear the outstanding payments to educators. It appears that they have again stopped paying their educators.

I don't believe they are financially viable to continue to operate. Auckland office is withholding the TAP 3 instalment due to the high level of risk (I understand the provider was planning to use the TAP 3 to clear the debts to the educators) I also understand that Wellington office has ceased their contract with them for SELO and word of mouth is that they have a \$250k debt to the IRD that they have stopped paying.

As a result, I have withheld their 1 June payment of \$71k until we can establish and finalise the debt and establish a payment recovery plan.

Dear Anthony,

 $\cdot$  Following the decision to withhold payment to Aoga I Maota Charitable Trust (Trust), the Trust now finds itself in a precarious position in that it will be in breach of its employment agreements with its employees.

The Trust believes that the withholding of payments is beyond or outside of the Framework Terms and Conditions (FT&C) notwithstanding the terms of the Outcome Agreement (Tap 3).

Clause 6.3 of the Framework Terms and Conditions provides that;

- 6.3 If the Conditioned Party does not satisfy or comply with any condition that is specified in the Outcome Agreement as having to be satisfied or complied with after the Outcome Agreement is in full effect, the Non-conditioned Party, may do any one or more of the following:
  - (a) Take action it is allowed to under the Outcome Agreement;
  - (b) Require a Remedy Plan to be agreed (if appropriate) and require the Conditioned Party to perform all actions recorded in the Remedy Plan. However, if a Remedy Plan is not entered by a date specified by the Non-Conditioned Party (acting reasonably), the Non-Conditioned Party can then take any other action it is allowed to under the Outcome Agreement;

It is the Trusts view that the Ministry of Education (MOE) should have activated clause 6.3 (b) above which required the implementation of a remedy plan prior to any withholding of funds or suspension.

The Trust has been in communication with MOE regarding TAP 3 Milestone 4.

In addition to the misinterpretation of clause 6.3 (b) of the FT&C, the Trust believes that the Ministry of Education has breached the Relationship Principles of the FT&C in failing to communicate openly and in a timely manner including a failure to work in a collaborative and constructive manner—including towards the resolution of real or perceived problems and issues, to name just two.

As alluded to above, the suspension of payment and the withholding of contracted payments is, not only inappropriate but in breach of the terms of the FT&C. This breach has impacted on the Trusts activities and ongoing liabilities and will no doubt result in the Trust receiving claims for compensation and/or damages.

The Trust is confused as to why the Ministry has taken such sudden and extreme action when alternatives were clearly available to it. This included a direct face to face meeting explaining the dire position that the Trust was in including the Ministry of Education's perspective on matters. Such a meeting would have discussed any information that allowed the Ministry to form its views on the Trusts performance and acquired any relevant responses from the Trust that could have contributed to Ministry's decision. The Trust believes that a Remedy Plan should have been considered in the first instance.

Finally, if the Ministry of Education has acted on any information that has been received from any source outside of the Ministry about the Trust then the Trust would appreciate that this information to be provided, without delay so it can provide the appropriate response.



#### Purpose

This memorandum is to provide you with information regarding the withholding of payment for Targeted Assistance for Participation Stream 3 (TAP3), Milestone 4 to Aoga I Maota Charitable Trust.

#### Recommendation

It is recommended that you:

- note the intention to withhold this payment subject to further investigation of this Service Provider's operations
- Use the information in this memo for any briefings required or questions asked about the withholding of payment

#### Background

A Targeted Assistance to Participation Stream 3 (TAP3) Outcome Agreement was signed on 29 June 2015 for Aoga I Maota Charitable Trust to establish a licensed Home Based network creating 80 new child places in Manurewa East and Wiri Census Area Units. The value of the agreement was \$99,650.00 and a balance of \$34,650.00 remains to be paid.

Mo Tatou In-Home Early Childhood Education and Care – Maninoa (46494) was subsequently established and issued a provisional license on 4 December 2015.

Aoga I Maota Charitable Trust has been operating as an ECE Service Provider since 20 September 2013 with two licences operating in Wellington (46300 & 46372). One further service was funded from TAP3 in Auckland, Mo Tatou In-Home Early Childhood Education and Care – Nafoaga (46497) which was licensed on 13 August 2014.

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#### Current Status

Below is the milestone payment schedule from the Outcome Agreement. Milestone 1-3 requirements were met and have been paid out.

I met with the provider in February and March 2016 where they noted they had faced some challenges with the Network Leader and some Educators resigning with a subsequent decline in children. They then submitted an action plan for the completion of the project by 30 June 2016.

Milestone 4 requirements have been met with the exception of the list of addresses of educators and the name, date of birth and address of children enrolled. The Provider has submitted a list of 62 children, but currently only 30 enrolments are showing on the Ministry's Early Learning Information database (ELI).



Thank you for your email, as I left my phone in Wellington.

I apologise for seeming confused or challenging, but I am trying to understand what is happening with our milestone 4 payment.

If you recall, we had emailed through our Milestone 4 documentation minus the Licensed Service Regulatory Compliance Audit Check on 15 April, 2016, however you only received the first email containing the ERO Self Review report. Based on prior experiences with emails being sent to the Ministry I felt this was because our emails were being stripped of which you later advised that you were receiving our emails marked as spam.

On the 12 May I sent an email request for payment to be made prior to 23 May, In your reply to this email, you indicated that you would process our payment on 13 May, pending receipt of a number of documents.

- 1. Our RBA Reports
- 2. The Milestone 4 Invoice
- 3. Licensed Service Regulatory Compliance Audit Check
- 4. Our story of Success supporting information for RBA report
- 5. Spreadsheet with an updated list of addresses of Educators and the name, date of birth and address of children enrolled
- and address of children enrolled 6. The above spreadsheet contains the additional 20 child places
- 7. Please feel free to contact me should you require any additional information.
- 8. ERO Self Review report

On the 13 May you sent an email acknowledging receipt of our documents and indicating that the payment would not likely be before the end of this week.

As our Xero package had put our original invoice dated 15 April into an overdue status we generated another invoice on 12 May, of which you are now calculating the 20 days, as per our outcome agreement.

We then received your email dated yesterday, advising of the payment being on hold pending the outcome of the audit – of which I only wanted to understand why this was occurring, as there is nothing I was able to find in our contract – and in my email this morning it just seemed sudden and severe.

It is not until today that you are now saying it is in relation to our documentation and ELi issues, which is frustrating, since we have been trying to facilitate payment of this completed milestone since 15 April 2016.

I am currently working on resolving the ELi issues.

We have had many issues with our TAP 3 contract in relation to delayed payments and missing documentation which has all impacted negatively on our service. 'Case in point, our licensing documentation, last August 2015, which was misplaced on 3 occasions, holding up our licensing visit, and our milestone payment, which then led to delay on our licensing and our RS3 funding.

I am only trying to ensure this does not continue and appreciate you working with us to resolve this issue.

It is my hope that you will be able to make payment as requested.

Thank you for your time Rhonda and I apologise once again if you felt I was being less than fair in trying to understand the delays in payment.

### Licensing summary

- Wellington met with the provider on 19 January to discuss the December 2015 complaints. The
  provider confirmed ongoing financial difficulties at this meeting, advising that they were unable to pay
  staff and educators until they received the 4 March 2016 funding payment.
- The provider produced affidavits from staff indicating their willingness to continue working for Mo
  Tatou despite the lack of payment.
- 5. Due to concerns about the impact of the provider's financial issues on the provision of education and care, Wellington increased its monitoring, conducting home visits on 22 March 2016. Minor breaches were identified, and the provider was given to 1 April 2016 to remedy the breaches.
- 6. The provider supplied information indicating they were changing systems and processes. These changes did not have the intended impact. On 8 April 2016 they were directed to undertake checks on all homes and provide confirmation of compliance by 18 April 2016. This was completed as required.
- 7. On 19 April 2016 a complaint was received alleging breaches to the regulations across both Wellington licenses.
- 8. On 29 April 2016 monitoring visits were completed to three homes. A significant number of breaches were identified relating to the health and safety of children.
- 9. License 46372 was reclassified as provisional and license 46300 was suspended. The suspension is in place until 30 May 2016 to provide an opportunity to meet specified regulations. The provisional licence has a compliance date of 3 August 2016.
- 10. There are currently no sanctions on either Auckland licence.

### **TAP 3 summary**

- 11. A TAP3 Outcome Agreement was signed on 29 June 2015 for the provider to establish a licensed home-based ECE network creating 80 new child places in Manurewa East and Wirl Census Area Units. This agreement relates to licence 46494.
- 12. This was the second TAP3 grant provided to Mo Tatou to establish a new service. Auckland licence 46497 was established as a result of a TAP 3 grant on 13 August 2013.
- 13. The value of the agreement was \$99,650.00. A balance of \$34,650.00 remains to be paid.
- 14. Milestones 1-3 of the agreement were met and payment subsequently made.
- 15. On 23 May the provider contacted the Minister's office and National Office about the delay in receiving their Milestone 4 payment of \$20,000. They advised in their communications that this payment was needed to pay their educators.

- 16. The due date for invoice payment is 10 June 2016.
- 17. Verification of milestone was delayed due to delays in receiving the data from the provider and then due to network issues. Verification of milestone enrolments was confirmed on 24 May 2016.
- 18. The Ministry must be satisfied that the project milestones have been completed. Clause 4.1 of the agreement requires the provider to satisfy a number of performance measures, including "children receive quality early learning experiences".
- 19. Given Wellington's licence sanctions, Auckland intend to conduct home-visits to determine if the performance measure noted above is being met. These visits will be completed before 10 June 2016.

### Funding summary

- 20. Following the December 2015 complaints the provider confirmed ongoing financial difficulties and was subsequently placed on monthly funding.
- 21. The provider appealed the decision advising they had commitments in place to pay educators and other bills and that monthly funding would not allow them to meet those commitments in the agreed timeframes.
- 22. Their request to remain on standard funding was declined. However the Ministry completed a special calculation to provide enough funding to meet the commitments of payment to educators within agreed timeframes.
- 23. Operational Funding then requested Resourcing Monitoring complete an urgent audit of the services. On 20 May Resource Monitoring advised that the audit had been completed, with a significant recovery totaling \$111,629.30 broken down as follows:
  - a. Licence 46300 (Lower Hutt) \$46,103.36
  - b. Licence 46497 (Auckland) \$36,479.08
  - c. Licence 46372 (Lower Hutt) \$29,046.86
- 24. On 23 May 2016 the Ministry received notification that the provider is again not paying their educators.
- 25. The Provider's 1 June monthly funding has been withheld due to the large audit debt. The provider was advised of this on 23 May 2016 by telephone. This will be confirmed in writing.

#### Other information

- 26. The Ministry has provided intensive support to the provider over a period of time: there has been regular and ongoing monitoring visits as well as the provision of SELO through the professional development work stream.
- 27. The provider has opened 4 new companies and is looking to move one service to each new company (currently they are all under 1 ECA). Both Wellington and Auckland have received applications to change the status of each individual network from a Charitable Trust to a Limited Liability company.
- 28. Barnardos have advised us that they have taken on some educators and children from the Mo Tatou services in Wellington.

### Issues requiring discussion and resolution

29. The following matters require discussion at the 25 May teleconference:

- a. A process for managing the licensing sanctions in place in Wellington and an investigation to determine whether similar regulatory breaches are present in the Auckland licenses.
- b. Next steps regarding the TAP3 milestone 4 payment.
- c. A discussion of the overall financial impact of the audit recovery debt in particular a plan for managing and monitoring the debt.
- d. The impact of the applications to change the status of the service.
- e. The development of a communications plan and possible Q&A's relating to the matter.

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- f. Next steps regarding the provider:
  - i. Arranging a meeting
  - ii. Determining the relationship lead

- ♦ We need to meet with the provider within a week to cover all issues with them.
- ♦ It was therefore agreed that:
  - A meeting should be held between the provider, Resource Monitoring, Operational Funding,
     Wellington (Elspeth) and Auckland (Yvette).
  - Each Ministry representative will lead discussion on their respective issues.
  - National Office will chair, co-ordinate and provide a note taker.

- The TAP3 outcome agreement also lists the following outcomes:
  - Ensure service meets and maintains licensing standards under Home-based Education and Care service regulations; and
  - Maintain quality of ECE delivery and effectively promote children's well-being and learning
- Given the extent of the licensing breaches noted in Wellington, we need to be assured that the 2 Auckland licenses are meeting these expected outcomes
- Provider has noted in e-mail correspondence that the milestone 4 payment is required to pay educators

#### **ACTION**

- ♦ Auckland to conduct monitoring visits to homes in both Auckland networks next week to be completed before 10 June and before the meeting with the provider
- ♦ Yvette to confirm dates of visits with National Office once organised
- ♦ Anita to explore with legal services whether TAP grant can be used to pay educators.

#### 4. Funding and debt recovery

- The 1 June operational funding payment has been withheld to recoup a portion of the debt.
- Funding will continue to be withheld until all debt is recovered.
- Given the extent of the audit recovery, Resource Monitoring will continue to be involved with the service. Further recoveries may result and will be managed via the same process.
- IRD debt has not been confirmed and is not being considered at this time.

#### 5. Entity changes

- The service provider has submitted EC8/08 applications in both Auckland and Wellington
- The application seeks to move the licences from the ECA, which is operated by a charitable trust, to individual limited liability companies.
- This technically constitutes a change of ownership, however it is the same people involved.
- ♦ These applications should not be progressed until all outstanding matters have been resolved.





# Need to know

Mo Tatou in-Home Early Childhood Education

Mo Tatou In-Home Early Childhood Education is a Pasifika home-based ECE provider with four licenses: two In Auckland and two in Wellington. In June 2015, it was awarded a Targeted Assistance for Participation Stream 3 grant for \$99,650 to establish a licensed home-based ECE network in Auckland creating 80 new child places in Manurewa East and Wiri.

The four services are currently linked under the name Aoga I Maota Charitable Trust. However, the provider has also established four new companies and is looking to move one service into each of the new companies. This means they will no longer be linked.

In December 2015, we received four complaints from educators working for Mo Tatou. The complaints related to non-payment of salary or wages to educators and staff. During investigation of these complaints, the service provider confirmed ongoing financial difficulties and was subsequently placed on monthly funding. In April 2016, a fifth complaint was received alleging breaches to regulations in both Wellington networks. As a result of the complaint one licence has been reclassified to provisional and one has been suspended. Both Auckland networks remain on full status however licensing visits are planned in light of the issues identified in Wellington.

A recent audit has resulted in a significant recovery of \$111,629 for three of Mo Tatou's networks. We have also been advised that the provider may have a significant debt to Inland Revenue and that they have ceased paying their educators and staff. The provider's 1 June 2016 funding payment of \$71,841 has been withheld due to the large audit debt and other related concerns.

We are in ongoing discussions with Mo Tatou on all these issues and will be scheduling a meeting with the provider next week.



- 20 Hours ECE funding eligibility (Chapter 4-2 of the Early Childhood Education Funding Handbook) This breach was identified in a previous audit (see letter 2 March 2015).
- Funding claimed for frequent absences (Chapter 6-7 of the Early Childhood Education Funding Handbook) This breach was identified in a previous audit (see letter 2 March 2015).
- Funding claimed for children enrolled at school (Chapter 3-A-1 of the Early Childhood Education Funding Handbook).
- Funding claimed for absences over three weeks (Chapter 6-5 of the Early Childhood Education Funding Handbook).
- Funding claimed for absences on public holidays (Chapter 3-A-2 of the Early Childhood Education Funding Handbook).
- Funding claimed for family member as caregiver (Chapter 3-B-4 of the Early Childhood Education Funding Handbook).
- Funding claimed for children with no timesheets (Chapter 6-3 of the Early Childhood Education Funding Handbook).

### **Audit Findings**

### 46300 Mo Tatou in-home Early Childhood Education and Care

This audit showed that the RS7 was:

- overstated by one thousand nine hundred and eighty (1980) hours at the Under Two Years of Age funding rate;
- overstated by six hundred and seventy (670) hours at the Two Years and Over funding rate;
- overstated by two thousand nine hundred and fifty (2950) hours at the 20 Hours ECE funding rate;

overstated by eight hundred and fourteen (814) hours at the Plus 10 funding rate.

- overstated by two thousand three hundred and sixty (2380) hours at the 20 Hours ECE funding rate;
- overstated by one thousand one hundred and eighty (1180) hours at the Plus 10 funding rate.

### Funding Adjustment

### Funding claimed for absences over three weeks

Chapter 6-5 of the Early Childhood Education Funding Handbook explains the three week rule for continuous absence. Funding for an enrolled child who is absent can be claimed for a maximum of three weeks, starting from the first day of absence. Hours claimed for Leo Funganitao, who was absent for more than three weeks, were disallowed.

### Funding claimed for frequent absences

Chapter 6-7 of the Early Childhood Education Funding Handbook explains the frequent absence rule. It ensures that enrolment agreements match attendance patterns as closely as possible. When any child regularly fails to attend for their enrolled hours or days, then the child's attendance must be monitored.

The frequent absence rule helps services identify absence patterns that suggest a change of enrolment may be needed. If there is a pattern of absences, then at the end of the second month, the parent must reconfirm, in writing, that the enrolment agreement remains valid, or change the agreement to match the attendance pattern. This confirmation allows funding, for the pattern of absences, to be claimed in the third month.

In the fourth month, funding for the pattern of absences must not be claimed, and the enrolment agreement must be changed to match the child's attendance.

An analysis of the attendance patterns over the audit period showed that Teresa Su, Delta-Jade Bishop, Inaki inaki, Mya Ngatangata, Kizel Tapue, Mele-Kaye Taupe, Falcon Teleaga, Marsden Teleaga, Alapasita Koloa, and Patricia Saipani regularly falled to attend for their enrolled hours or days. The audit has discounted the continuing pattern of absences in the third month and subsequent months.

### Funding claimed for absences before first attendance

Chapter 3-A-2 of the Early Childhood Education Funding Handbook explains that funding begins on the first day a child attends a service, or is due to attend, as specified in the enrolment agreement. One week of absences can be funded providing the service has the required documentation. Funding was disallowed for Rose Samelu, Moses Letimanu, Hadassah Fa'aaliga-Mene, Jay Lelataua, Falcon Teleaga, Marsden Teleaga, Jasmine Sarwaish, Alex Lota, Renee Putaura, Ramada Putaura, Bryan Htut, Htet Kay, and Legend King when there was no documented reason for absences claimed.

### Funding claimed for 20 Hours ECE funding

Chapter 4-2 of the Early Childhood Education Funding Handbook describes the 20 Hours ECE conditions that must be met by a service/parent. The conditions are:

 Services must not claim 20 Hours ECE funding for a child until the parent/guardian has completed a signed and dated attestation.

Funding discounted at the 20 Hours ECE funding rate was allowed at the Two Years and Over funding rate for Abigall Olive, Jirch-Grace Taanoa, Katrina Pesaleli, Rosalina Tol'u, Zephaniah Crowe, Vitalius Tuioti, Helamana Alago, Janita Tuimauga, and Disleyn Lesa where there were no attested hours for the period claimed.

### Funding claimed for children enrolled at school

Chapter 3-A-1 of the Early Childhood Education Funding Handbook explains that funding cannot be claimed for children once they are enrolled and attending school. Funding was disallowed for Albert Andrews, De'Jon-Lemz Nikoalo, and Corleone Afioga where funding was claimed (for a school holiday programme/after school care) when they were enrolled at and attending school.

### Funding claimed for absences on public holidays

Chapter 3-A-2 of the Early Childhood Education Funding Handbook explains that services can claim funding for children who attend services that are open on a public holiday. Funding must not be claimed for children who are absent where the children are not enrolled to attend on the specific holiday. Hours claimed for Stephen Puefua, Payton Vela and Puataunofo Sisifo who was not enrolled to attend on Labour Day, were disallowed.

Your enrolment processes for public holidays must be amended to match the care requirements of your parents. Parents must only enrol children on public holidays if they require care on this day,

### Funding claimed for family member as caregiver

Chapter 3-B-4 of the Early Childhood Education Funding Handbook explains that funding must not be claimed for an educator's grand-children living at the same address.

Funding claimed in relation to Maiya Hunter-Simeona, Serene Finau, and Mati'a-Anei Tili was disallowed as they were the educator's grandchild living at the same address.

### Funding claimed for children with no timesheets

Chapter 6-3 of the Early Childhood Education Funding Handbook describes the attendance records that must be kept by a service. These include the days and times of actual attendance.

The audit identified that a number of timesheets were missing. Funding was disallowed where there were no timesheets to verify child attendance.

### Record Keeping Requirements

### Early Childhood Education (ECE) Funding Handbook

Access to Ministry of Education funding for early childhood services is conditional on meeting funding criteria as outlined in the Early Childhood Education Funding Handbook. Updates to the handbook can be found on www.education.govt.nz/early-childhood.

#### Requirements for enrolment records

Chapter 6-1 of the Early Childhood Education Funding Handbook describes the enrolment records that must be kept by a service. These include:

- the child's full name, date of birth, and home address;
- the date the child commenced attendance at the service and their finish date;
- the days and times each child is expected to attend, and details of any later changes to the agreement signed and dated by at least one parent/guardian;
- attestation by the child's parent/guardian of the hours the child is enrolled at another service (including none if appropriate); and
- a dated signature of at least one parent/guardian to attest to the accuracy of the enrolment record.

The enrolment exemplar is available in the Early Childhood Education Funding Handbook. It includes a requirement for services to gather birth certificate information for the Early Learning Information (ELI) system. All early childhood services are required to have updated their enrolment forms and gathered the birth certificate information for all children.

Some sections of the Enrolment Agreement Form have compulsory wording, which cannot be changed except to add relevant details for your service. Please review and make the necessary changes to your Enrolment Agreement Form. All Enrolments Agreements Forms must comply with the *Early Childhood Education Funding Handbook* exemplar.

### Requirements for 20 Hours ECE attestation records

Chapter 4-2 of the Early Childhood Education Funding Handbook describes the 20 Hours ECE requirements that must be met by a service.

- Services must not claim 20 Hours ECE funding for a child until the parent has correctly completed, signed and dated attestation details.
- Changes to attested hours must be signed and dated by the parent and show the effective date of each
  change as only the hours that the parent or caregiver have confirmed and signed can be claimed.
- Parents must notify services if there is a change to the 20 Hours ECE their child receives at any service.

### Requirements for attendance records

Chapter 6-3 of the Early Childhood Éducation Funding Handbook describes the attendance records that must be kept by a service. These include:

- each child's first name and family name;
- the days and times of actual attendance;
- a record of any absence with an "a" when a child is absent at a time they are enrolled;
- notes and explanations when a child is absent from the service;
- attendance registers that have been marked by staff on a twice daily basis;
- evidence that a parent or guardian of each child attending the service has regularly examined and confirmed the attendance record. This requires the record to be signed at least once a week.

It is critical that the actual times of attendance are recorded to ensure that your staff hour count is correct, casual attendance is claimed where applicable and you are able to effectively monitor the frequent absence rule.

#### Summary

These audits identified some significant issues. Chapter 11-1 of the Early Childhood Education Funding Handbook explains that services risk losing funding if their records cannot be audited because they are unclear or ambiguous, or are not available for audit.

I draw to your attention to the RS7 Declaration which states that:

 "...I confirm that this funding claim is made in accordance with the conditions outline in the Early Childhood Funding Handbook..."

The Ministry considers the issues raised in this audit to be serious breaches of the funding rules. You must write and explain to the Ministry the reason for these breaches. In particular, please explain:

- In your letter dated 4 May 2015, you confirmed that processes would be put in place to ensure that
  previous funding breaches would not continue. Why did these processes not work? Why was 20
  Hours ECE funding claimed for children who had no attestation records and why was funding claimed
  for frequent absences?
- 2. Please explain why, in this period, many of the time-sheets were not signed or dated by the educators and parents? What process will be put in place to ensure that children who have left the service and children who have not yet started, are not claimed for funding?

- Why was funding claimed for children enrolled at school?
- 4. How was funding claimed for absences over three weeks when APT is designed to automatically override this?
- 5. Why was funding claimed for children when the educators were unavailable to provide care?
- 6. Why was funding claimed for family members as caregivers outside of the funding rule restrictions?
- 7. What processes will you put in place to ensure that these breaches do not happen again?

Your response must be made in writing to The Manager, Monitoring, Ministry of Education, PO Box 1666, Wellington 6140. This letter should be sent to the Ministry by Monday 13 June 2016.

### Reporting and Recovery

The audit results were discussed with you and Roseanne Leota (CEO) at the end of the audit. I would like to thank you and Roseanne for your assistance during the audit.

As your claim for the period was overstated, your funding will now be adjusted. The adjustment will be made in your next funding payment.

If you disagree with the findings of the audit, you have the right to appeal. An appeal must be made in writing to The Manager, Monitoring, Ministry of Education, DX Box SR51201, Wellington. The appeal must be received by the Ministry no later than 20 working days from the date of this audit report.

Thank you for your email, consideration and understanding as to the delay in getting back to you with scheduled visits, for Maninoa (46494).

As a result of our meeting on Tuesday, you did allude to not having all the information when making your decision to not pay out our milestone 4 payment on 13 May and that you would be following this up.

It is important for us to once again relterate the impact that this decision has caused — we have not been able to fully pay our staff and educators.

I need to impress that while the Ministry of Education changes the Milestone 4 payment conditions — our people are suffering in a situation which is becoming intolerable.

Delaying this payment has profoundly and seriously affected the children in our licence.

Had this payment been received, all staff and educators would have been fully paid.

Therefore we have had to adapt our business to meet the current financial needs before us.

Before these decisions were made, the community, educators, and staff needed to be informed of what our current status is, seek advice from them, and others for a way forward.

These decisions are now being implemented throughout Mo Tatou, and the effects will continue to ripple through until 1 July 2016.

Coming back to the visits: We understand that the longer we wait for these visits to occur the longer it may take for the payment of Milestone 4. It is our desire to get this part of your conditions met, as quickly as possible. And we agree that next week will be great to get these done.

You have a list of our educators for Maninoa submitted with the milestone 4 report.

May I have the number of homes that you're interested in visiting next week, along with the names of Educators/addresses, times and dates please?

We want to ensure that when you do visit, that these homes and educators are current.

Looking forward to seeing that list today, Yvette.

Thank you for the information you have provided to show your progress in meeting the conditions outlined on the Provisional Licence issued to Mo Tatou In-home Early Childhood Education and Care – la Ta'aui Measina (46372) on 14 April 2016.

Please find enclosed an amended Provisional Certificate of Licence issued under Regulation 33. This amended licence is effective from 10 June 2016 and is to replace the Certificate of Licence currently on display which must be returned to this office immediately, as required by Regulation 16(1)(a).

The information received in this office on 7 June 2016 and the information collated on the monitoring visits conducted on 9 June 2016 has been assessed. The outcome of our assessment is outlined below.

Seven of the conditions have been assessed as meeting compliance and have been removed from the Provisional Licence.

Regulation 28 and 44 (1) (d)

As your service is currently experiencing fluctuating numbers of educators and children I am extending the compliance timeframe for Regulation 28(2) (a), (b), (c) and 44 (1)(d) to 3 August 2016. This enables you to continue meeting compliance and ensures the health and safety of children attending your service is not impacted by your current financial situation.

Regulation (2) (c)

It is noted that children have been observed in playgroup settings in a number of learning stories provided to show compliance with Regulation 28 (2) (c). You are reminded that the person responsible must take all reasonable steps each month to

observe each child participating in the service while that child is receiving education and care. Please note these visits should occur in the home where education and care is being provided.

# Regulation 28 (1) (a)

I am requesting you provide monthly updates on the premises registered in this licence and have added this condition to the Provisional Licence.

# 9 June 2016 - 20B Kokiri Cresent, Porirua (Home 1)

I understand this educator will be in Samoa for the next two weeks, however prior to her recommencing work with your service the following Regulations and Criteria need to be met:

- PF4 A variety of equipment and materials is provided that is appropriate for the learning and abilities of the children attending.
- Regulation 57 (1) (a) It was identified and observed by Ministry staff that the
  educator potentially has a medical condition that affects her balance and coordination. I am requesting that a medical certificate is provided from a
  registered medical practitioner confirming the educator's physical health does
  not pose a risk to children attending your service.

The breaches to Home 1 have not been added to the Provisional Licence as compliance is required prior to the educator commencing education and care on her return from Samoa.

# Complaints received by the Ministry of Education

Since meeting with you on 31 May 2016, I am advising you that the Ministry has received three complaints in this office from people in your Porirua network. These complaints relate to your service's inability to ensure educators in your network are reimbursed for their work. I also understand you are aware of this issue as the complainants advised that they have made contact with you. My staff were unable to contact all complainants as no contact details were provided for follow up.

These complaints continue to cause concern at your ability as a licensed service provider to ensure educators meet regulatory requirements at all times. I strongly urge you to give consideration to the future ongoing financial viability of this licence.

## Barnardos - Issues raised by you

My staff have followed up with the Service Provider Contact for the Barnardos home-based licences who has provided assurance that they only visit educators who have made contact with them. The Service Provider Contact has undertaken a process to ensure that Mo Tatou educators are not visited unless they make contact with Barnardos in the first instance. They have also undertaken to ensure that Mo Tatou educator's are not visited by anyone employed by Barnardos outside of their contractual hours.

As set out in this amended Provisional Licence, the conditions for which compliance is still required must be complied with by the dates specified.

As earlier advised, a Full Licence will be reissued to the service when every condition set out in the amended Provisional Licence has been complied with by the dates specified. If however any condition specified has not been complied with and compliance is still necessary, the service's licence will be cancelled.

Please note that the centre's licence must be assessable for parents in accordance with the requirements of GMA1.

Also note that the service provider must ensure the service continues to comply with any conditions set down in the licence and with the *Education (Early Childhood Services) Regulations 2008*. The service provider shall also ensure that the premises conform to the bylaws of the local authority.

Please find enclosed an EC/8 "Application to Amend an Early Childhood Licence Certificate" for any future amendments.

I've provided answers to best address the questions that Anita posed here:

In the past 5 months, our organisation has been implementing a strategy that will allow for our organisation to restructure so that our operation would be financially viable into the future. The goal of the plan is to ensure that each license would be able to sustain itself financially.

This plan was put through our organisation restructure, and recommended by our accountant, and as such I've cc'd him on this email.

In regards to the amounts owing to the Ministry as a result of the audit, each of the new entities are named according in part to their license, i.e. Malaeola (46300), Ia Taaui Measina (46372), Maninoa (46494), and Nafoaga (46497).

Each entity would be responsible for the amounts owed for each license, as you've detailed below.

Any future debt, incurred by one of our licenses, will be similarly assigned, to the entity with that license number.

Mo Tatou Malaeola Home Based Learning Limited will be responsible for all debts incurred under 46300 Mo Tatou Ta Taaui Measina Home Based Learning Limited will be responsible for all debts incurred under 46372

Mo Tatou Maninoa Home Based Learning Limited will be responsible for all debts incurred under 46494 Mo Tatou Nafoaga Home Based Learning Limited will be responsible for all debts incurred under 46497.

If any future debt were incurred by 46300, (Mo Tatou Malaeola Home Based Learning Limited) and there isn't sufficient funding to service the complete debt, then the total debt will be assumed equally by the remaining 3 entities, above. The June 2016 RS7 should clarify this situation.

Tap 3 funding with outstanding milestones 4 and 5:

Since tap 3 was utilised to set up license 46494, we would like for this association to continue. All liabilities involving Tap 3 will be assumed under Mo Tatou Maninoa Home Based Learning Limited, which currently is Maninoa 46494. All payments due will be deposited into the Mo Tatou Maninoa Home Based Learning Ltd account.

Currently, all requirements for Tap 3 are being managed and handled by our Auckland team, with the main contact person being (Sala) Roseanne Leota, and that will continue going forward.

We hope to implement all requirements for milestone 4 by the end week, and presently, are on track to complete milestone 5, soon thereafter, before the deadline of 30 June 2016.

Any further queries regarding reporting requirements Tap 3 will be handled through Roseanne Leota.

Finally, any monies owed to The Ministry from Aoga I Maota Charitable Trust, due to the clawback of most recently completed audit, we would repay using the funding that each of these networks will be receiving from The Ministry.

We are working with our teams to submit our June 2016 RS7's, for all 4 of our networks, so that Teena, and her team are able to make a decision surrounding the plan in repaying all funds owed.

When the June 2016 RS7 is completed, we will then submit a plan of repayment.

Anita emailed us the questions below, to clarify the Ministry's position, in accompanying our recent application for change of entity.

Please find attached EC8/08HB applications for each of the entities.

I've provided answers to best address the questions that Anita posed here:

In the past 5 months, our organisation has been implementing a strategy that will allow for our organisation to restructure so that our operation would be financially viable into the future. The goal of the plan is to ensure that each license would be able to sustain itself financially.

This plan was put through our organisation restructure, and recommended by our accountant, and as such I've cc'd him on this email.

In regards to the amounts owing to the Ministry as a result of the audit, each of the new entities are named according in part to their license, i.e. Malaeola (46300), Ia Taaui Measina (46372), Maninoa (46494), and Nafoaga (46497).

Each entity would be responsible for the amounts owed for each license, as you've detailed below.

Any future debt, incurred by one of our licenses, will be similarly assigned, to the entity with that license number.

Mo Tatou Malaeola Home Based Learning Limited will be responsible for all debts incurred under 46300 Mo Tatou Ia Taaui Measina Home Based Learning Limited will be responsible for all debts incurred under 46372

Mo Tatou Maninoa Home Based Learning Limited will be responsible for all debts incurred under 46494 Mo Tatou Nafoaga Home Based Learning Limited will be responsible for all debts incurred under 46497.

If any future debt were incurred by 46300, (Mo Tatou Malaeola Home Based Learning Limited) and there isn't sufficient funding to service the complete debt, then the total debt will be assumed equally by the remaining 3 entities, above. The June 2016 RS7 should clarify this situation.

Tap 3 funding with outstanding milestones 4 and 5:

Since tap 3 was utilised to set up license 46494, we would like for this association to continue. All liabilities involving Tap 3 will be assumed under Mo Tatou Maninoa Home Based Learning Limited, which currently is Maninoa 46494. All payments due will be deposited into the Mo Tatou Maninoa Home Based Learning Ltd account.

Currently, all requirements for Tap 3 are being managed and handled by our Auckland team, with the main contact person being (Sala) Roseanne Leota, and that will continue going forward.

We hope to implement all requirements for milestone 4 by the end week, and presently, are on track to complete milestone 5, soon thereafter, before the deadline of 30 June 2016.

Any further queries regarding reporting requirements Tap 3 will be handled through Roseanne Leota.

Finally, any monies owed to The Ministry from Aoga I Maota Charitable Trust, due to the clawback of most recently completed audit, we would repay using the funding that each of these networks will be receiving from The Ministry.

We are working with our teams to submit our June 2016 RS7's, for all 4 of our networks, so that Teena, and her team are able to make a decision surrounding the plan in repaying all funds owed.

When the June 2016 RS7 is completed, we will then submit a plan of repayment.

Please find our written responses below to the questions you've asked us on your letter I received via email on the afternoon of  $24^{th}$  of May 2016.

Dated 23rd May 2016.

1. In your letter dated 4 May 2015, you confirmed that processes would be put in place to ensure that previous funding breaches would not continue. Why did these processes not work? Why was 20 Hours ECE funding claimed for children who had no attestation records and why was funding claimed for frequent absences?

The breakdown in our systems was due to staff departures in August 2015. Staff that we had trained and had been an integral part of our SMS and enrolment process. These staff left suddenly before new staff were fully trained, this impacted on the level of knowledge required and quality of training provided.

In terms of 20 Hours ECE, the systematic change that was needed to be made was a change to the child's enrolment agreement. As per the Ministry of Education enrolment form exemplar, any changes to the enrolment agreement are recorded on the back of this form. Therefore, any changes to enrolments where attestation was required, only captured the assigned hours and parents sign off – not the actual attestation. We were doomed from the beginning due to an oversight for this form. And this oversight affects our breach of 20 Hours ECE directly. This breach of 20 ECE accounts for almost half of the breaches, in dollar amounts.

We have now changed the back of our enrolment form to include the attestation details (copy attached). In addition to this, an automatic reminder within our student management system has been setup so that when a child is about to turn 3 an attestation is generated through our system and dispensed to those team members that complete enrolments. In terms of the retention of knowledge for systems and processes an operational manual with enrolment procedures both for our student management system and hard copy enrolments is being implemented.

In addressing our frequent absences, our system broke down for we had relied on a manual way of managing the absences. We relied on staff to ensure that absences were recorded correctly, with reconfirmation attended to periodically. As I stated earlier, the training needed for the staff that came aboard on September was not enough to maintain the level required to do an adequate job, and funding should not have been claimed for frequent absences. We currently have given these tasks to experiences staff from this point forward.

Please explain why, in this period, many of the time-sheets were not signed or dated by the educators and parents? What process will be put in place to ensure that children who have left the service and children who have not yet started, are not claimed for funding?

As an organisation, we have been lax in ensuring that parents and educators. We needed to ensure that if those things were not completed, then we needed to not reimburse these educators. As an organisation, we've delivered to parents and to educators in the past 2 weeks how to correctly fill in a sign in sheet, for the educator and for the parent.

To ensure sign in sheets are signed and dated by the educators and parents:

- Educator reminders letter
- Parents reminders letter
- Enrolment form update
- Sign in sheets process

To ensure funding not claimed for children when the educators are unavailable to provide care:

- Educator reminders letter Statutory/Public Holidays
- Sign in sheets process
- On-going educator monthly professional development

To ensure attestation records for 20 Hours ECE funding are correct:

- . Enrolment form update Office Use Only checklist
- Enrolment form update changes to updates to include attestation questions

To ensure funding is not claimed for frequent absences:

- Sign in sheets process
- Master manual frequent absence assessment 2016

In regards to children that have not yet started, the enrolment form there will be a checklist which ensures that the person entering the details of the enrolment forms have double checked on whether the child has started, and have actually attended before we put in a claim for funding. This same person, is also now responsible for ensuring the child has started, will also be responsible for the child that has left the service. The tasks of both starting and of ending the child's enrolment will now fall on one person to complete, rather than 3 different individuals

3 Why was funding claimed for children enrolled at school?

It was our understanding through discussions with the parents that all children listed, were not enrolled at school whilst being enrolled with our service. It has highlighted the need for our service to maintain written confirmation from parents when they have advised that the child is not enrolled at school?

4 How was funding claimed for absences over three weeks when APT is designed to automatically override this?

In terms of this point, we were required to discuss with APT, as we were unaware of how this had occurred. APT replied: "... his leave date was extended out from the 2nd October to the 7th December on the 6th October. This may have reset the count from the original leave date. I attach the email from APT." I have attached the email provided by APT. In checking our records it appears that this child left the service and then was re-enrolled but did not attend on the date they had re-enrolled.

5 . Why was funding claimed for children when the educators were unavailable to provide care?

Educators that were unavailable due to the holiday period needed to be briefed on what they needed to put on their sign in sheet. A review of how to properly account for this day, whether they're available for care, and no children arrive, rather than put down "holiday" when no children arrive. This is an ongoing professional development situation to be covered monthly during educators' professional development

6 Why was funding claimed for family members as caregivers outside of the funding rule restrictions?

Unfortunately, we have caused some confusion concerning the family members as caregivers and the associated funding rule restrictions. For two of the Educators identified – Kimiora Vara and Ane Pahulu, they both provide education and care from homes that neither they nor the related family member they live with, reside at. In terms of the third child, Mati'a Tili, her residential address was recorded incorrectly and not picked up by our staff, as that of her Grandfathers, but she has at no time, resided there.

7 What processes will you put in place to ensure that these breaches do not happen again?

The following processes have been put in place to ensure that no further breaches occur, of which we have started implementing prior to the submission of the most recent RS7:

To ensure that children who have left the service are not claimed for funding:



### Purpose

This memorandum is to provide you with information regarding the licensing spot checks recently undertaken for the home base service provider Mo Tatou Maninoa 46494.

### Background

Licensing Spot Checks were instigated in response to concerns the local office in Wellington had with Mo Tatou home based services in their region.

Mo Tatou has two existing home base services in Auckland. This service established in December 2015 and Mo Tatou In-home ECE and Care Nafoaga 46497 set up in August 2014.

Both home based services received (Maninoa is still receiving) TAP funding.

### Spot Check Findings

The list of 24 educators/homes (and 62 children) submitted in the end of May to randomly select 5 homes to spot check was reduced to 9 available educators/homes by Mo Tatou.

5 homes were selected and Spot Check visits occurred 7th June - 10th June.

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## Summary Spot Check Key findings

- Premises and Facilities
  - Access of main in/out door areas of play compromised ongoing supervision.
  - Broken fence exposed a gap a child could climb through.
  - Another home had no outdoor play.
  - Most of the homes with under-two year olds did have designated space for children to safely sit, lie down or crawl.

## Governance, Management and Administration

- Attendance records either based on the Daily Diary carbon copy pad or the Educators time sheets. Both records did not meet ECE Funding Handbook requirements.
- Educators Administration record keeping had no chronological order. One Educator had personal bank statements amongst the sleep charts.
- Homes held different policy and procedure versions. One home had 2015 another had 2016.

## Child Health, Medicine and First Aid

- Sleep, Food, Medicine, Illness and Accident charts were either; not completed, completed incorrectly or, recorded on different templates charts.
- Either Educators held no first aid certificates, had recently attended a course and waiting for first aid certificate or, copy of first aid certificate held at Head office.

## Health and Safety

- Educators could not provide evidence of daily hazard checks.
- One home had dirty dishes stacked on the bench and in the sink.
- Need to review items in the Emergency bag e.g. 4 cans of spaghetti, 4 rolls of toilet paper, no nappies/bottles for under twos, warm clothes for children?
- Consistency with policy/procedure and practice.

### Curriculum

Not age/developmental appropriate. Teaching under-two year olds 1,2,3
 and a,b,c oppose to exploration learning via sensory play.

- Limited Educator effective engagement with children.
- Limited in and outdoor resources. Homes that had ample resources were their own.
- No evidence of curriculum planning or individual planning/progressive learning.

## Risk/s

A number of breaches were identified. No evidence of health and safety checks and Educators with no first aid certificates on hand.

Spot Checks identified a number of potential risks to children's learning and health and safety.
