Dear Mr Johnson.

Thank you for your email of 17 August requesting the following information under the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA):

- "1. Cabinet Growth and Infrastructure committee decision [EGI Min (12)27/9] dated 3/12/2012:

- 3. The respective cabinet papers and the Ministry for the Environment's advice to the Minister for these two regulations:
 - 3(a) The Climate Change (Eligible Industrial Activities) Amendment Regulations 2013 (LI 2013/45), dated 25 March 2013,
 - 3(b) The Climate Change (Eligible Industrial Activities) Amendment Regulations 2014 (LI 2014/124), dated 14 April 2014."

The attached table lists the seven documents falling within the scope of your request and notes any OIA provisions that have been applied. Withholdings have been made under the following sections of the Official Information Act 1982:

Section 9(2)(a) – to protect the privacy of natural persons

Section 9(2)(h) – to maintain legal professional privilege

Section 9(2)(b)(ii) - protect information ...likely unreasonably to prejudice the commercial position of the person ... who is the subject of the information

Section 9(2)(f)(iv) - maintain the constitutional conventions for the time being which protect...the confidentiality of advice tendered by Ministers of the Crown and officials.

The Ministry for the Environment's response [16-D-00601 dated 16 June] to your earlier related request outlines the process for making unit allocations to NZAS under the NZ ETS. This involves updating the relevant regulations every year. The process protects the Crown from over-allocating units.

Cabinet previously approved for the Minister for Climate Change Issues to submit regulation proposals direct to Cabinet each year to update the NZAS allocative baseline.

Annual regulation updates are needed to reflect NZAS's unique arrangements for electricity supply. This means that NZAS generally receives a lower allocation than it would if its electricity purchases were recognised using the standard electricity factor in 6(a) of the Climate Change (Eligible Industrial Activities) Regulations 2010. Documents iii, iv, vi and vii of this request relate to this annual process of updating these regulations.

NZAS renegotiated its electricity supply contract in 2013 and a new method of calculating its allocation was required, to reflect the NZ ETS cost passed through under the electricity contract. Ministry for the Environment agreed with NZAS that an interim methodology was required for that year, and that it was only to be used until a final methodology could be established. An interim methodology was used in 2014 to make sure NZAS was able to apply for its allocation for that year by the statutory deadline.

A final methodology for the renegotiated contract was approved by Cabinet and used in 2015 to finalise the 2014 and subsequent allocations. Documents v and vi refer to the interim methodology, and ii refers to the final methodology.

The Ministry for the Environment will be pleased to assist you further should you require additional elaboration of technical matters or procedures concerning NZAS's annual baseline updates.

Under section 28(3) of the OIA, you have the right to ask the Ombudsman to review my response to your request.
