Silverdale School – Roll Projections

Scenario 1: Silverdale School remains Year 1-8

Between 2011 and 2015, on average the Year 1 roll increased by 14 students each year. The projections assume the Year 1 roll will follow this trend and increase by 14 students each year. Historical retention rates have been used for Years 2-8.

If Silverdale School remains a Year 1-8 school, the roll of the school will continue to grow with projections showing a roll of over 1000 students by 2021.
