Dear Mr Carter

Thank you for your email of 19 October 2016 requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act), the following information:

- How much of our sold and consumed [seafood] in NZ is imported?
- How much imported seafood is checked and tested?
- What precautions are taken to ensure that anti-biotics, antifungals and antiparasitics are not in imported seafood?
- What oversight or monitoring is done or carried out to ensure the correct regulations are adhered too?
- What monitoring is done to ensure that restaurants, processed fish fish markets indicate where their fish comes from and whether they were farmed or wild caught?

Information which answers your first question is publicly available on Statistics NZ's website, in the National Accounts input-output tables: http://bit.ly/2eV144s. The tables provide information about supply (domestically and imported) and use (in industry as well household consumption) of fish and crustaceans.

You have the right, by way of complaint to the Office of the Ombudsman under section 28(3) of the Act, to seek an investigation and review of this response to your request.

Statistics NZ intends to publish its response to your request made under the Act on the <u>Statistics NZ website</u>. This letter, with your personal details removed, will be published in its entirety. Consistent with the Act, publishing responses increases the availability of information to the public and helps promote balanced public debate.
