Dear K. I. Davis,

I refer to your email of 12 December 2016 requesting information under the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA) relating to Ngā Taonga Sound & Vision. Your request is considered below.

- *Please supply all agreements, including but not limited to Memorandums of Understanding, letters of understanding, contracts etc., between the Ministry for Culture and Heritage and Ngā Taonga Sound & Vision (New Zealand Archive of Film, Television and Sound Ngā Taonga Whitiāhua Me Ngā Taonga Kōrero) from 2014 onwards.*

Please refer to the documents attached in Appendix A. Your request asked for agreements between Ngā Taonga Sound & Vision and the Ministry for Culture and Heritage. Several of our key agreements with Ngā Taonga are signed by the Minister for Arts, Culture and Heritage rather than the Ministry, including our Memorandum of Understanding. We have provided these documents as well as we believe they are a part of the information you seek.

Please note that final draft versions of agreements have been provided where a signed version was not available.


- *Please supply all reports, proposals, plans from 2014 onwards that have been either been received by the Ministry, authored by the Ministry or commissioned by the Ministry in relation to the current or future management / structure of, funding of, or location of what was formerly Sound Archives Nga Taonga Korero and its collections, which now is part of Ngā Taonga Sound & Vision (New Zealand Archive of Film, Television and Sound Ngā Taonga Whitiāhua Me Ngā Taonga Kōrero).*

Please refer to the information attached in Appendices B and C. This information has been provided as excerpts as the majority of the information contained in the reports is outside the scope of your request. We have not included information that is publicly available, for instance in Ngā Taonga annual reports or Statements of Intent.

Personal information has been withheld under section 9(2)(a) of the OIA to protect the privacy of natural persons. I do not consider that public interest considerations outweigh the need to protect this information.

You have the right, under section 28(3) of the OIA, to ask an Ombudsman to review my responses to your requests.
