Dear Mr Hanna

Thank you for your email of 21 June 2017, requesting information about the Department's decision to release nine Crimes of Torture Act (COTA) reports. Your request has been considered under the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA).

You have requested:

All communications regarding the decision to release these reports. I
intend this to include discussions of which reports should be released,
which should not, and (where possible) what information should be
withheld from the reports.

The Department made the decision to release these nine COTA reports following two separate requests for four and five COTA reports respectively. As the individual requests were for a limited number of reports the Department was able to respond to the requests without substantial research or collation. In light of the number of requests the Department has received for various COTA reports, it was determined it would be appropriate to release these reports publicly, rather than a release to the individual requesters only.

There is no written documentation concerning this decision and your request is therefore declined under section 18(e), of the OIA as the information requested does not exist.

The Department completed an assessment of the reports in preparation for release. This is standard practice to ensure that no information is released which could compromise the security of the prison or the privacy of any individual. The Department holds one document in relation to the information withheld from these reports. This document contains free and frank advice around the release of the reports. In addition, it contains some personal

information of other individuals. This document is withheld in full under section 9(2)(g)(i) of the OIA, to maintain the effective conduct of public affairs through the free and frank expression of opinions by or between or to Ministers of the Crown or members of an organisation or officers and employees of any department or organisation in the course of their duty and under section 9(2)(a) of the OIA to protect the privacy of natural persons.

- The names of all people and organisations who were sent a copy of the media release, or any other notification of these reports having been published.
 - a. If other notifications of these reports having been published were sent, please provide copies of these communications.

The Department published the COTA reports on its website at which time the two original requesters were notified of the publication. The Department also notified the Office of the Ombudsman that the reports were being published. Copies of the email communications are enclosed with this response. The names and organisations of these individuals are withheld under section 9(2)(a) of the OIA, to protect the privacy of natural persons.

The Department did not notify any other parties of the release. It is noted that the publication of these reports was accompanied by a statement attributable to Chief Custodial Officer Neil Beales which provided an update on the work completed by the Department in response to the recommendations of the COTA reports. While the statement is listed under the 'press release' section of our website, it is in fact a Department statement. It was published on our website to provide Corrections' views and context on the COTA reports. It is not unusual for Corrections to put statements on our website which are not sent to the media.

 Any communications regarding who should or should not receive a copy of the media release or a notification of the reports having been published.

No information relevant to this part of your request has been identified. Accordingly, this part of your request is declined under section 18(e) of the OIA, as the information does not exist or, despite reasonable efforts, cannot be found.

I trust the information provided is of assistance. Should you have any concerns with this response, I would encourage you to raise these with the Department.
