Dear Mr Dalton

Thank you for your email of 11 November 2017, requesting information about average incomes of offenders. Your request has been considered under the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA).

You have asked:

If available, I request available statistics regarding the average incomes of those who have low-level convictions, and serious convictions, and if possible average incomes prior to the first imprisonable offence. I am primarily concerned with those who have served time in prisons.

Your request is declined under section 18(g) of the OIA as Corrections does not hold the information requested and we have no grounds for believing that it is held by another agency or more closely connected with the functions of another agency.


