
Summary of results from Public Transport Survey

The survey was sent out to all CPH staff on the 16th of July and closed on the 20th of July. Three respondents answered more than once, the final count of unique responses was 60.

The results are not as robust as we would have liked as there appears to be some gaps in the answering of some questions particularly for those who use the bus regularly/sometimes. In the initial days this appeared to be due to a direction request in the survey being incorrect but once fixed there were still gaps. Many had issues with the system when trying to complete the survey and look up the link on the internet so this may have contributed to the problem. A printed copy was left in the kitchen for people to refer to. Many found it very hard to follow.

The following is a summary of the responses – further analysis can be undertaken as required. The percentages are all based on the number who answered the question not the total number who answered the survey; with the gaps in the data this is the most accurate way to report it.



For those who do not bus to work currently:

Q: What factors discourage you from busing? (N=44) The following are the broad headings the complete list of comments is in the Appendix

- Prefer to cycle (n=7) or walk (n=1)
- Issues with the route, including waiting for buses, no stops close to work or limited service in their area (n=27)
- Time or takes too long (n=8)
- Other commitments make bussing inconvenient (n=4)

Note within individual comments more than one of these might be true their main factor is used to work out the n value above.


Q: What factors might encourage you to use public transport? (N=44) The following are the broad headings the complete list of comments is in the Appendix


- Injured so would not be able to bike (N=3)

When asked about travel time the following was provided for just these four respondents. All four indicated there travel time was consistent each day.

- 30 mins
- 25 minutes
- 15 mins
- 1hr 45 mins

- Convenient, affordable, nearby home and work, acceptable comfort
- Sustainable No parking Can read on the bus I don't have a car most weekdays (1 car family)
- The bus stop is close to where I live
- less fuel costs more exercise better for the environment


When asked what factors discourage you from taking a bus to work the following responses were given


- None



Appendix 1 – Full list of comments

Q:What factors discourage you from bussing? (N=46)

Like other activity i.e. cycling

- I enjoy cycling. If I couldn't cycle I would walk and taking a bus would be my 3rd option
- I prefer to bike
- Prefer to cycle
- I like to bike to work to incorporate exercise into my daily routine
- I prefer to bike so I have less impact on the environment and include my exercise into my day
- I don't need to, I live close enough to walk or cycle.
- I like to walk

Route issues including waiting for buses

- Would need to walk a reasonable distance as well ie not 'door to door'
- distance to walk to bus and along to work
- the route does not go anywhere my workplace I would have to walk quite a long way or get another bus
- live in the country and there is no bus service
- lack of route
- Bus route does not take me directly from home to work
- It isn't as direct since the earthquakes
- · Waiting around in the cold Timing of bus
- There are no buses that would get me to work
- waiting in the cold, takes longer to get home
- Time it departs, where it drops off
- Departure times not suitable, not stopping near work
- comfort, frequency, whether I would have to take more than one bus, unwelcoming
- A long walk at the end to get from Carlton Mill Corner to 310 Manchester St
- interchange/station, smokers in bus stops.
- Too far More convenient to travel by car as more flexible with time and enables other activities, e.g. gym, shopping.
- Takes too long to get to work, time doesn't suit me also not stopping near work.
- Knowledge of bus routes and times, bus stops. Frequency of bus times ie less flexibility due to limited bus services available.
- There have been no buses running from Avonside Drive (opposite Locksley Avenue) since the 4 September earthquake.
- distance to walk to bus and along to work
- Additional of walking ie not close to 'door to door'
- The bus I would take from Halswell has no Bus Stop location close to the office.
- Have to stand still in the cold, rain and wind, have to be on time, have to change buses, have to interact with the proletariat, can't easily choose to do something unusal on the way home from work, uses fossil fuels

• Early start in the dark, mid afternoon finish, infrequency of service

Issues of time

- Time
- time
- length of time involved

Other commitments make it inconvenient

- Quality whanau time driving my daughter to school, good time to talk and keep connected Needing my car to be able to pick up my daughter for orthodontists and specialists appointments or emergencies
- In the morning I drop off my children at school and then drive on to work. At the end
 of the day I drive from work to school, pick up the kids and then drive home. No bus
 service would allow me to do so
- I have other commitments after work and sometimes I do after hours home visits (for work) on my way home.
- More convenient to take car as can leave when ready, rather than to a 30 min bus schedule. If wet gotta walk to bus stop and stand in the rain. I worry whether bus will be on time or not. Can't get very close to work, still got to walk. Takes more time. Note that my preferred mode of transport is bicycle rather than car or bus.

Q: What factors might encourage you to use public transport? (N=46)

Injured so would not be able to bike (N=3)

- if i had an injury which would prevent me biking
- If I was injured and unable to cycle
- Unable to cycle e.g. disability

If it took less time (n=4)

- safe car parking in a town near my place and a good bus timetable ie not having to wait an hour for the next bus
- the return of the express service that means less travel time and greatly reduces the numbers of school students
- bus lanes to reduce time
- Faster Time

If the routes were more direct, frequent (n=18)

- frequent service, one bus taking me near enough to workplace
- Getting from Wairakei Rd to Mancester St and frequent services
- Either a direct route to Public Hospital or at least closer to same
- More direct bus service
- less time, ie more direct route
- If I could get to Manchester St more easily than taking 2 buses need a single trip each way

- To have more than one place to get the bus that goes into Central City.
- More direct route (happy to walk a small distance)
- · Will check out if there is a direct route
- A direct bus route or central (to work) bus exchange
- If it was a quick process and close drop-off then I would consider it.
- quick direct routes, tidy and safe interchange/station and buses, low-cost.
- Having more than one stop to go into Central City
- A regular bus service in working hours.
- If there was a bus stop outside my house with a route that went close to work. Having several options for catching a return bus after work (ie not just one particular time). Easily accessible and up-to-date information about bus services.
- If it ended up somewhere near work

Other (n=10)

- More enclosed bus shelters More regular Cheaper prices
- proximity and bus shelters in the winter. I have used this service previously on a reuglar basis
- Other than another job nothing.
- Living close to work
- If i moved further away from work I would consider taking a bus.
- If it was only me to consider If the bus service was reliable and routes known, they keep changing in Shirley Richmond due to the road closures
- The bus would only get me home from work there are none that would get me to work in the morning
- Being able to leave the children at school earlier than 8.30 which would then allow me to catch a bus and still get to work on time.
- The straight forwardness of the bus route
- Better motivation, less cost, less time walking to ferry and from Central depo to work *If petrol got more expensive (n=4)*
 - petrol getting dearer significantly
 - Good to sit back and not have to take responsibilty for the driving. If price of petrol
 goes up then maybe more cost efficient to take bus. If I want to do a walk/bus
 combination
- Perhaps price vs petrol for my own car but timing would need to be frequent *Nothing (n=2)*
 - None
 - Nothing would encourage me to use the bus.
