Official Information Act 1982 request

Thank you for your Official Information Act 1982 (OIA) request of 12 March 2018 regarding the Land Transport Act 1998. Your request and my response are set out below.

Please note that section 52A of the Land Transport Act 1998 (Act) relates to the contravention of section 114 of the Act.

Can you please provide the information as to the sentences given to individuals charged with "failing to stop" under Section 114 of the Land Transport Act 1998 since 1st January 2010. Please include any occasion where the defendant was convicted and discharged.

Please list by year and sentence.

- Instances of 'No sentence recorded' include where an offender has been Convicted and discharged and where an
 offender has been ordered to pay court costs.
- 'Deferment' means an imprisonment sentence with a deferred start date.
