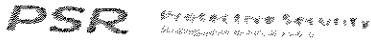

Protective Security Forum – 4 October 2016

Post-Forum Summary

Thank you to those who joined us on Tuesday for one of the most well-attended forums to date. It was wonderful to see some new faces, but sorry that others of you were unable to make it. We have some resource material from the forum to share with you.

As per the agenda, we covered a range of topics across the protective security domains. Rather than recap it all in this message, we have attached the slide pack.

To add some detail, however:

PERSEC Review

[REDACTED] update focussed very much on the PERSEC 1 elements. He emphasised the importance to all agencies of comprehensive employment screening policies, including the positive identification of prospective employees, their eligibility to work, and that their character renders them suitable for the role. We were also reminded that it doesn't just stop there; the management of our people, including the ongoing assessment as to suitability is also particularly important.

INFOSEC

[REDACTED], DIA's All-of-Government Enterprise Architect, System Transformation, presented the background to the recent SEEMAIL v3.1 launch and the essential differences between the Standard and Restricted user groups. The importance of considering the security of documented information, regardless of whether it is held within IT systems or outside it (such as in hardcopy form) was stressed. It's a timely reminder to note that any government information is official information, whether or not it carries a protective marking.

In addition to what he provided at the forum, [REDACTED] has provided a link to some useful resource material. There is a lot of information here: <https://www.microsoft.com/en-us/trustcenter/compliance/nzcc>. Whilst your IT staff are probably familiar with this, those of us not working in that environment may not be. There will be more to come regarding INFOSEC, including subjects such as Microsoft O365 and its compatibility with SEEMAIL.

PHYSEC

Our major presentation of the day concerned the creation of flexible government working environments, the benefits that are accrued (whether in a co-located or co-tenancy situation) and the PHYSEC considerations for multiple agencies with individual risk profiles. [REDACTED] a Programme Manager with the Government Property Group

illustrated this cultural shift for many agencies from 'my space' to 'any place' using the Christchurch Integrated Government Accommodation (CIGA) example. He showed that agency security threat and risk assessments, and the PSR's PHYSEC zoning principles, are fundamental to the design of these areas, as is the role of the health and safety regulator, WorkSafe NZ.

Connect Smart Week: 10-14 October

Finally, DPMC's Director of the National Cyber Policy Office (NCPO), [redacted] took the opportunity to promote Connect Smart Week. Whilst there is dedicated activity during the week, the messages regarding cyber security are constant. NCPO's resource pack is attached for agency use.

Last Words

Thank you all for the part you play in building government's security capability. The Protective Security Forums and our team's engagement with you are just one element of this. Your participation in, and promotion of, practices which enhance protective security are most important. We hope the information provided and networking opportunities at the forum have assisted you in your role.

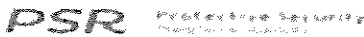

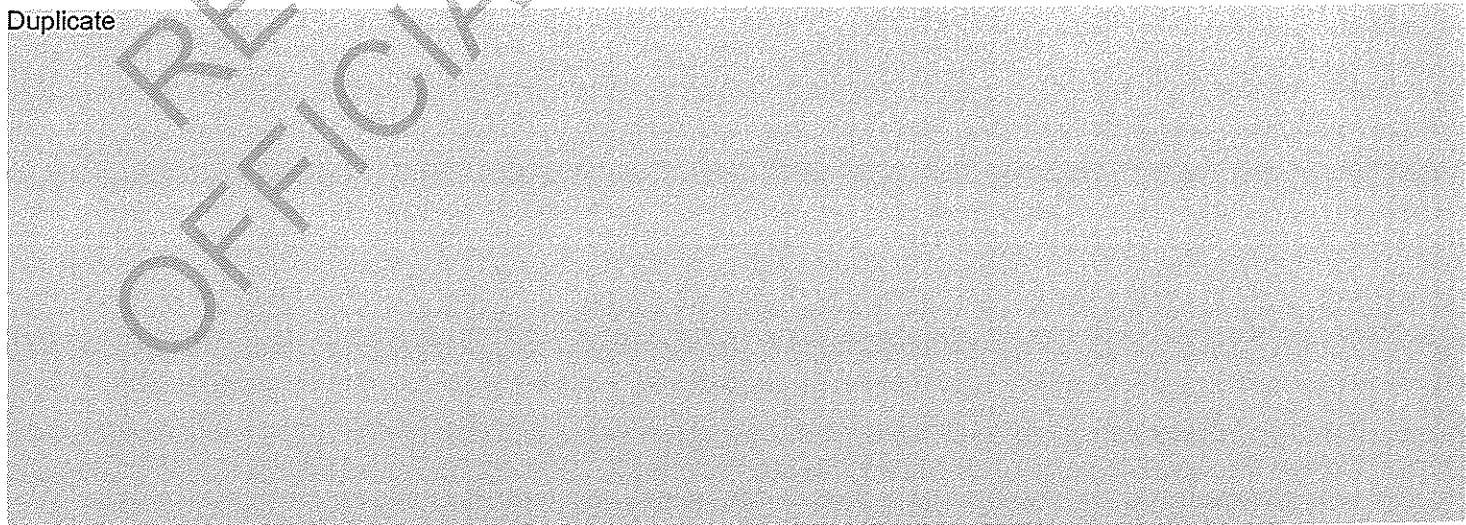

NZSIS is subject to the OIA and must release official information unless there are good reasons not to [section 5 of the OIA]. We have identified falling within scope of the request communications between Thompson & Clark Investigations to NZSIS's Protective Security Requirements team. You will likely be aware of these which entail namely advice on PSR matters from one of our "friendly trusted advisors".

There are good reasons to withhold information under the OIA where an obligation of in-confidence was promised at the time of transmittal, and we agree that given the advice Thompson & Clark Investigations was seeking, we believe this promise existed where PSR advice is sought and given on various matters discussed with Thompson & Clark Investigations. If you do not believe this is the case please correct me otherwise. Also, some of the communications are of a professional personal nature like arranging catch-ups etc., therefore, there are good reasons to withhold this information under privacy reasons. We also agreed there is a commercial element to some information falling within scope, so this reason applies to some information, which is being withheld.

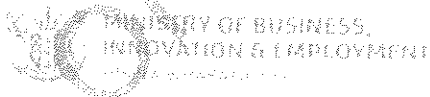
