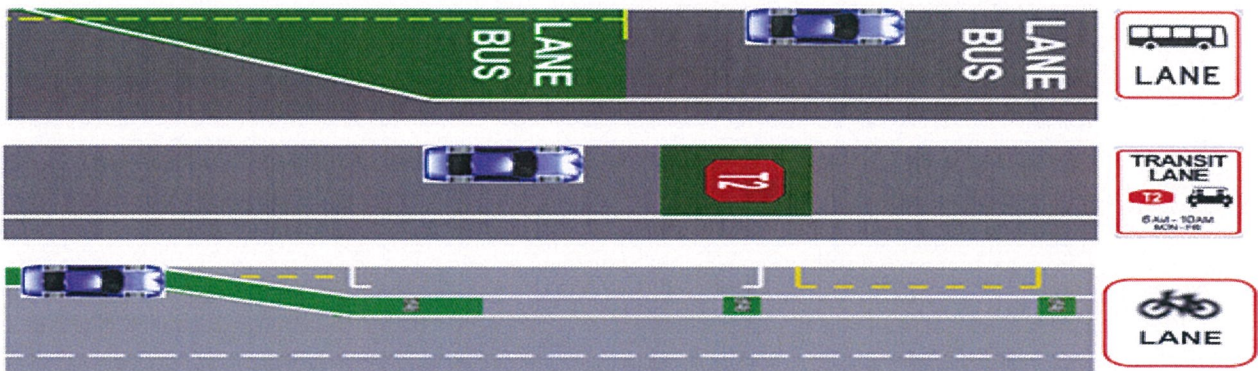

<b>P128</b>	<b>Parked in a special vehicle lane</b>
(Infringement = \$60) S.40 Land Transport Act 1998 & r.4 Offences & Penalties Regs 1999 & 6.6 (Road User) Rule 2004 (SR 2004/427) (as at 11 December 2009)	
<b>NOP</b>	Being a driver or person in charge of a vehicle did stop stand or park the vehicle in a lane restricted to a specified class or classes of vehicle without belonging to that class

All Blue vehicles shown are parked in a lane restricted to a specified class or classes of vehicle without belonging to that class. Subject to the operational hours of that special Vehicle lane.

### Land Transport (Road User) Rule 2004 (SR 2004/427) (as at 11 December 2009)

#### Part 6.6 Parking in special vehicle lane

A driver or person in charge of a vehicle must not stop, stand, or park the vehicle in any special vehicle lane unless—

- (a) the vehicle belongs to a class of vehicle for which use of the lane is reserved, and stopping, standing, or parking of the vehicle is permitted at that place by signs or markings; or
- (b) the vehicle is an emergency vehicle that is being used in an emergency and is operating a red beacon or red and blue beacons.

**What do these road markings mean? Where can a vehicle park?**



**Vehicles must park next to the solid white line. The broken white line is a “buffer” for the opening of car doors and is part of the cycle lane.**

**Do you know the difference between a CYCLE LANE and a CYCLE PATH ?**

CYCLE LANE - means a longitudinal strip **within a roadway** designed for the passage of cycles



CYCLE PATH - means a part of a road that is **physically separated from the roadway** that is intended for the use of cyclists, but which may be used also by pedestrians;
