1.3.16 Parked in a Residents Only park without a valid permit

PARKED IN A RESIDENTS ONLY PARK WITHOUT A VALID PERMIT:

Offence Code P105 – Fee \$40-00

Handheld Code: RESIDENT

If vehicle is parked...

You need to confirm...

Then take these actions...

Within an area reserved for vehicles without a valid Residents Parking Permit.



- At least two red and white Authorised Resident Vehicle signs are present in the area, indicating the car is parked in a residents parking zone.
- For "At all times" spaces yellow road markings are present.
- For "8am-6pm Mon-Fri" and "P120" resident spaces white road markings are present.
- The vehicle is not displaying a valid Residents Parking permit.
- The vehicle is not displaying any other valid permit that would authorise it to be parked in the area (such as a Trade Permit).
- The vehicle is parked outside of any permitted parking times that are indicated by the signs.

- Photograph the vehicle in a way that clearly reveals its position in the residents zone or any other area it may be straddling, such as a coupon zone or vehicle entrance
- Photograph the vehicle registration plate, dashboard and windscreen (lacking a permit), plus the signs including those with any time restrictions.
- Record a description of the signs, the serial numbers of any invalid permit and any notes that appear on the dashboard.
- Issue an infringement notice.

Legislation

Land Transport (Road User) Rule 2004 (SR 2004/427) (as at 11 December 2009) RULE 6.4 Parking contrary to notice, traffic sign, or marking

- (1) A driver or person in charge of a vehicle must not stop, stand, or park the vehicle on any part of a road contrary to the terms of a notice, traffic sign, or marking that—
- (a) indicates that stopping, standing, or parking vehicles is prohibited, limited, or restricted; and
- (b) is on or adjacent to the road; and
- (c) is authorised by a road controlling authority under the Land Transport Rule: Traffic Control Devices 2004
