How much has been spent annually on HIV treatment and support annually over the past 35 years. | Due to section 18(e) of the Act, I am refusing this request, due to the fact that the information requested does not exist, and despite reasonable efforts to locate it, it cannot be found. |
| | It is not possible to accurately account for the total annual spend on HIV treatment and support in New Zealand over the past 35 years as the time frame is too wide, and specialist, diagnostic testing and screening services provided for people with HIV are also accessed for a wide range of other health issues. The Ministry of Health does not collect data on the cost of clinicians' time spent on HIV. |
| | However, the cost of all antiretroviral treatment for 2017 is estimated at \$36.66 million; a 2017 PHARMAC report provides this figure. This can be found in the column on page 2 at https://www.pharmac.govt.nz/assets/2017-Year-in-Review.pdf . |
| 16.
