It is important to check shorter length barrel rifles and shotguns that can be broken down, to ensure that they cannot be removed. Racks are to be secured to frame of building by hardened one-way screws or bolted with welded/burred nuts. Cabinets and safes are to be tested for security of fixings to building.
