The importance of keeping separate, the investigation into an interim move of NTSV Taranaki Street operation to the National Library (NLNZ) building from the investigation into potential for long term co-location associated with PtNM initiative, was reiterated.

### Potential NTSV Taranaki Street move to NLNZ building:

- Rebecca will be reporting on the potential move to the NTSV Board on 16 August an indicative budget will be required
- Key questions:
  - Will they fit (approx. 70 staff workstations plus technical rooms required)?
  - o Can the ICT needs be supported adequately anticipating that for capacity reasons NTSV will need their own fibre connection?
  - o Is the rental cost affordable for NTSV?
  - o Is the one-off cost of move affordable for NTSV?





A summary of the valuation as requested below. Please note there may be more detail in there than you require but I thought it best to include it as its easy enough to delete.

Please let me know if you need anything more on this from me.

On instruction from Rob Stevens and Lewis Brown, the Property Group obtained a rental valuation in relation to the office space within the National Library that may be occupied by Nga Tonga in the future.

As Nga Tonga's requirements are not clear at this stage, the valuation was undertaken on assumptions provided by Rob and Lewis.

#### **Backaround**

The valuation provides two rental figures per annum which are based on the following two options:

- option 1 comprises a rectangular open plan work area spanning four office bays with exclusive use of one of the nearby meeting rooms. The space is located to the southern portion of the third floor, close to the shared cafeteria.
- Option 2 comprises an area resembling an L-shape, occupying the south western corner of the floor and containing an open plan work area along the southern wall, with the remaining area to the western side more densely partitioned into meeting rooms, offices and a reception area with direct access to the lift foyer. Please note that Option 2 has been identified as the more 'superior' space within the valuation in terms of lighting and air, greater privacy, existing partitioned space/meeting rooms, potential to further partition off space, separate kitchenette area within the space, and direct access through the lift lobby.

Estimated areas upon which the valuation is based

- One basement server cabinet (this requirement may change to two); 0.48m²

- Lower Ground Floor Office: 288.36m<sup>2</sup>

- Option 1: 416.7m<sup>2</sup>

- Option 2: 496.88m<sup>2</sup>

#### Proposed Rental as at 1 February 2019

Option 1: 9(2)(j) , plus GST Option 2: 9(2)(j) , plus GST

The above figures are inclusive of all property operating expenses with the exception of tenancy consumables and a share of the electricity. A gross lease is what has been recommended by the valuer and the figures above are based as such.

I believe that IKS suggested a net lease however, net figures could not be determined as we are not yet in a position to ascertain the share of operating expenses which Nga Tonga is to be responsible for. Note that the building is also not separately metered in order to do so in relation to electricity.



#### Potential NTSV Taranaki Street move to NLNZ building:

- Rebecca will be reporting on the potential move to the NTSV Board on 16 August an indicative budget will be required
- Key questions:
  - o Will they fit (approx. 70 staff workstations plus technical rooms required)?
  - o Can the ICT needs be supported adequately anticipating that for capacity reasons NTSV will need their own fibre connection?
  - o Is the rental cost affordable for NTSV?
  - o Is the one-off cost of move affordable for NTSV?



- If above matters can be solved then NTSV suggest signing up to a Heads of Agreement with a planned move in date of Jan Feb 2019
- Work streams NTSV have identified are ICT, logistics and construction, communications/stakeholders, workflow changes
- NTSV working assumption of the "interim period" is in the order of 5-7 years
- DIA will assist by:
  - o Firming up where everything fits into the NLNZ (e.g. staff on L3, and technical rooms on LG);
  - Work with NTSV to find an ICT solution (note this may have implications for NLNZ upgrade);
  - o Preparing cost estimates for the related fit-out works and rental;
  - o Developing an operating and security plan;
  - 9(2)(j) and
  - o Liaising/synchronising with NTSV around logistics, communications and workflow needs.

# 9(2)(g)(i) 9(2)(g)(i) and this provides the opportunity for co-location and leveraging common functions of Archives and National Library utilising a physical link. This opportunity could extend to NTSV although further investigation is needed to better understand the opportunity, 9(2)(g)(i) 9(2)(g)(i)

- therefore there is a timing issue of when the opportunity for NTSV is well enough described, therefore it is proposed this be covered by later addendum or similar when scope and cost are known.
- Rebecca noted that while there were a number of really similar functional and specialist needs to Archives and National Library that could benefit from co-located, there are also significant differences including operational, service delivery and stakeholder
- expectations.



Please note, there will be a need for cooling in the server room, scanner room, and video transfer spaces – (currently proposed where the records room, quiet room and meeting room are) so your plant/building manager would need to have a look at whether it is possible - ideally 18 degrees.

The main reason I wanted to get something like this to you, is that it gives you property/finance folks an opportunity to figure out what (if anything ①) you'll need to charge us on an ongoing basis!

In terms of Q3 – is there a building manager who could meet onsite with Chorus to discuss running new Fibre in? This will also be a go/no-go question...

Following up from our visit to NTSV facilities last week, I wanted to make a start on gathering the needs for THE potential co-location of your staff at Taranaki Street to the National Library building in Molesworth Street.

Are you able to send me a brief outline your requirements that would meet the objective of staff operating out of Molesworth Street including needs for:

- Number of staff and workplace setup
- Specialist studios or technical spaces
- ICT setup and pipeline needs
- Public interface and signage
- Receiving/dock-way access and parking
- Any other unique requirements (over and above the basic facilities of the National Library)

High level at this point is fine (including space needs where known), appreciating that further detail will be gathered once this becomes a project.

Also an outline of your thoughts on:

- What functions remain in Taranaki Street facility and any major workflow issues
- Proposed changes to the functions at Avalon facility and/or any alternatives/options in the mix

I suggest we work on the basis that while this move is to meet the immediate needs, it may be in place for up to 5 years (by which time DIA is likely to have coming on stream new or upgraded facilities from PtNM). The point here being it is more than just temporary, i.e. needs to be sustainable.

Please let me know if you need to visit the Molesworth Street to refresh what you know about the facility.

Richard, I'm happy to help with the setup of a governance committee to guide this work as proposed by Peter, with you a chair. Do you have someone in your team who could draft a Terms of Reference for this committee? Also note Peter's request that governance needs good linkages into the officials group for NALI and our PtNM Board.
