- Claims are still being accepted for damage resulting from the 14 Nov, 26 Dec and 20 Jan aftershocks. The claim deadlines are 14 Feb, 26 Mar 2011 and 20 Apr respectively.

- Site offices are currently operating in Halswell, Rolleston, Kaiapoi, Fendalton and Rangiora.
- There is also a non-geographical hub carrying out emergency repairs for habitability, safety, weather-tightness etc.
- Further sites in Spreydon Heathcote and Hagley Ferrymead are due to be established in January and February respectively.
- Two hubs per month will be added up to the end of April.
- o By the end of April there are expected to be 12 hubs plus the emergency response hub.

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4. General Issues

4.1 Loss estimate

- The revised loss estimate stands at \$2.75bn-3.5bn.
- Further visits from reinsurers Renaissance Re will conduct a review of Canterbury related claims.
 The review is intended to ensure claims are being managed in line with best practice and assess the respective liabilities of EQC and government concerning land remediation. Other Reinsurer visits are expected to follow.

4.2 Land Remediation

- EQC has established a dedicated delivery group of technical personnel to work with T&T on a concept design report. The report will facilitate the lodging of resource consent applications and promote understanding and coordination of relevant work by EQC, councils and private insurers.
 - The suburb-by-suburb geotechnical investigation programme and interpretation reports expected to be completed by mid-Feb.
 - Agreement with insurers re houses to be demolished in all areas also finalised by mid-Feb.
- Representatives from EQC, DPMC and Christchurch City Council met on 23 Dec to plan the legal and policy work to be undertaken in January 2011 on land remediation.
 - Principles were agreed with both councils and delegations given to CCC and Waimakariri District Council chief executives to enter into MoUs with EQC.
- The Historic Places Trust statutory consultation period means the work to mitigate the lateral spreading to properties in Spencerville has been delayed until 31 Jan.
 - The timetable provided by Daniel Smith Industries, who have been contracted to undertake this work, is:
 - 7 Feb start mobilisation on site and preparation work by 7 Feb
 - 16 Mar start stone columns
 - 30 Apr stone columns completed
 - 28 May removal of sheet piling temporary works and replanting completed.
