Further to our conversation a couple of weeks ago regarding SROUBEK / ANTOLIK, I went back to the Czech authorities to confirm that we have the correct understanding of their case against him, as there are a few slightly conflicting variations in our records. They have confirmed that the following summary is correct:-

Just to update our records and to confirm that our authorities fully understand the judicial processes that SROUBEK faces upon his return to the Czech Republic, can you please confirm that the following summary is correct:-

1. Prosecution

He is wanted for prosecution in connection with an incident on 07/09/2003 when he was one of a group of men involved in a violent attack on a victim, during which the victim was shot dead by another member of the group. We understand SROUBEK faces charges of "Attempted Bodily Harm" and "Disorderly Conduct" in connection with this incident. 19 ACX

Is he also facing a charge of "Murder"?

2. Service of sentence

He is wanted for service of a sentence of 54 months imprisonment in connection with an incident on 28/06/1999 in which he attacked and grievously injured two Police officers, and another incident on 04/10/1999 when he attacked a taxi driver. We understand that on 12/02/2002 he was convicted in relation to these two incidents for the offences of "Disorderly Conduct", "Damaging of Another's Property", and "Attacking a Law Enforcement Officer".

Does he have any other convictions in the Czech Republic, other than the three convictions referred to above?

Are we correct in our understanding of the case against SROUBEK?

In answer to the two questions above, they advise that he has not been charged with murder (they have identified the shooter and it appears SROUBEK has not been charged as a party despite his involvement in the attack), and he has no other convictions in the Czech Repiblic other than the three convictions referred to at (2) above.

Could you please notify me of any developments in regards to parole so that I can keep my Czech counterparts updated.





Sroubek was seen by the Parole Board last week and his case has been deferred until Sept 2018 to seek a Psychiatrists report. It was Sroubek's first appearance at the Parole Board and his Statutory Release Date (SRD) is Jan 2022

Afternoon AL

I have had a look into this case.

We have known about this fellow for some years and his convictions here in New Zealand certainly mean that he falls within the deportation provisions of the Immigration Act . His case, however became derailed when he appealed his conviction to the Court of Appeal. All processing on his case ceased until the outcome of the appeal was determined.

We only became aware earlier this month that the appeal had been dismissed in December last year. So the deportation process is now back on track. That process is to provide submissions to the Immigration Minister to see whether he is prepared to make Sroubek liable for deportation. If agrees then he will sign the appropriate notice for service on Mr Sroubek. I understand from the team that the process to get it before the Minister could take a couple of months and that we should have a decision by end of June 2018.

Should Mr Sroubek be served with a Deportation Liability Notice (DLN), he will have a right of appeal to the Immigration and Protection Tribunal and will need to file that appeal O L. ACX within 28 days of have been served the DLN.

There is no sign (yet) of a refugee claim.

I am writing to you immigration New Zealand (INZ) has commenced an investigation into whether you are liable for deportation. Our reasons for believing you may be liable for deportation are as follows:

- On 16 September 2003, you arrived in New Zealand using a Czech Republic passport numbered which was in the name of Jan Antolik, date of birth 20 October 1981.
- On 5 November 2007, you lodged an application for residence under the Work to Resident, Talent – Sports Category. You applied using the false identity of Jan Antolik and provided the passport numbered 9(2)(a) for the application.
- On 6 June 2008, INZ approved the residence application and granted you a residence permit.
- During a court case in 2010 it was revealed that a finger print check carried out by the New Zealand police with the relevant authorities in the Czech Republic confirmed that you were not Jan Antolik but rather your true identity was Karel Sroubek, date of birth 28 February 1981.

It therefore appears that you may be liable for deportation under section 156(1)(b) of the Immigration Act 2009 for holding a visa under a false identity.

The Minister of Immigration or a delegated decision maker will now decide whether your deportation should proceed. You are invited to make submissions on this matter, which will be considered by the Minister or delegated decision maker before a decision is made. You may wish to comment on the grounds for your deportation liability, your personal circumstances, and the circumstances of your family.

A deportation questionnaire is enclosed for you to complete should you wish to do so. You and your family are also welcome to provide additional submissions and documents in support of your case. Please provide copies of documents only; originals may not be returned. All information provided must be in English or include an English translation.

The completed questionnaire and any supporting submissions must be sent to the address below before **13 April 2018**. You can send your response via email, rather than by post, as long as any documents scanned are of a reasonable quality. If you wish to post or courier



your response, please send it to the address listed below. Do not send it or take it into your nearest branch of Immigration New Zealand.

Please note that we do not require the following documents to be provided:

- Your passport;
- Copies of your passport pages and those of your family;
- Letters from Immigration New Zealand (as we have access to these already); and
- Large numbers of photos (originals or copies).

If you do not complete the questionnaire or make submissions before 13 April 2018, your case will be presented to the Minister or delegated decision maker using the information currently available. If you have difficulty meeting this deadline, you may contact me to request an extension.

If the Minister or delegated decision maker decides that you should be deported, he or she will sign a deportation liability notice which will be served on you. Your right to appeal against your liability for deportation, if applicable, will be outlined in the deportation liability notice. If the Minister or delegated decision maker decides that your deportation should not proceed, your deportation liability will be suspended or cancelled.

Please note that being liable for deportation does not affect your residence status. If you are working or studying you may continue to do so while this matter is considered. You will lose your resident status only if and when any appeal right against deportation liability expires.

Good morning Angela. I refer to your letter of 29 March 2018 as to Mr Sroubek's potential liability under s 156(1)(b) Immigration Act 2009.

The letter set a date for reply of 13 April 2018. I have met with and taken instructions from Mr Sroubek who remains in Auckland South Correctional Facility, and we are in the process of gathering materials. However, I must ask for an extension of time to reply for the following reasons:

1. Mr Sroubek has already commissioned a private investigator to seek evidence and prepare a report on the risks facing him on return, and in particular relating to the criminal individuals in the Czech Republic who are one reason for his flight from that country. He informs me today that this may take another 3 weeks to prepare, to be translated and to be provided to us;

I propose an alternative deadline of Friday, 18 May 2018 to provide a full reply. Note that Mr Sroubek had a Parole hearing in March and that a decision on his early release has been deferred for 6 months until a further Parole Board appearance.
