Response to two requests under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act)

Thank you for your request under the Official Information Act 1982. You asked:

- How many fines have been issued to employers for failing to mandatorily report possible teacher serious misconduct under s396 Education Act http://www.legislation.govt.nz/act/public/1989/0080/latest/DLM6526336.html?
- How many investigations have been conducted under s396 of Education Act?
- If there have been any investigations or fines, what was the nature and outcome of each investigation or fine?

There have been no investigations or prosecutions under s 396 of the Education Act.

Accordingly, no one has been convicted under s 396, and no fines have been ordered under this section of the Act

There has been one disciplinary matter where the Disciplinary Tribunal considered whether a failure to make a report amounted to serious misconduct, but that arose from a conduct investigation rather than an investigation under s 396.
