The DVD *Shoot 'Em Up* is restricted to adult viewers because of its high extent and degree of violence, the occasional inclusion of sexual material intended for adults and the frequent use of highly offensive language.

The main component is the feature *Shoot 'Em Up* (83 min), a black comedy that sends up the "shoot-'em-up" action genre. Additional components consist of several deleted or alternative scenes, extensive behind-the-scenes footage, an item on the drawn animation used to plan scenes and three trailers for the feature.

The feature opens with a man (Clive Owen) sitting at a bus stop eating a carrot. A man with a gun runs past in pursuit of a terrified and very pregnant woman. The man (known only as Smith) is reluctantly stirred into action: he delivers the baby while fending off numerous hitmen. When the woman is killed by a stray bullet, he - again reluctantly - rescues the baby. The remainder of the feature revolves around his efforts to look after the child (he approaches a lactating prostitute) and to find out why the gang wants the baby dead. Other elements of the superficial storyline include a dying presidential candidate and gun control supporter who has several women impregnated so that he can harvest the babies' bone marrow. On the opposite side is a wealthy arms manufacturer responsible for hiring the gang to kill the women. FBI men are also in the picture. Mayhem ensues as Smith, the baby and the prostitute run from all these groups.

Matters of sex and violence have been considered under s3(1) and s3(3)(a)(i) of the FVPC Act. Offensive language has been considered under s3A. The material does not fall under the

criteria of s3(2). The juxtaposition of sex and violence has been considered under s3(3)(a)(ii) but does not affect the classification.

The feature contains sexual scenes and incidents with a sexual tone, such as the gang leader cupping the breast of a dead woman. The main woman character is a lactating "hooker" (known as DQ - "Dairy Queen") and there are brief glimpses of prostitutes engaged in sexual activity. DQ is interrupted with a diaper-wearing client who is pulled from her breast and told the bar is closed. However, the man is not seen suckling. The standout sexual scene is between Smith and the prostitute, who form a relationship. The scene begins with foreplay, including a male hand between the woman's legs. Naked upper torsos moving in a simulation of intercourse are then shown. The gang arrive and the couple roll off the bed, still joined, and intercourse evidently continues while Smith periodically turns and sprays bullets at the attackers.

Gun battles pepper the feature and are frequently the focus of other components. The extent and degree of the infliction of serious physical harm is extremely high. As one character comments, "Violence is one of the most fun things to watch." Few scenes in the feature go by without a shoot-out and the body count is enormous. When guns don't work, hero and villains resort to other methods, such as physical assault or demolition derbies in fast cars. The strangest weapons are the hero's trademark carrots, which are plunged into heads through the mouth or eye (and seen protruding from the back of one man's head). There is a macabre humour attached to much of the violence: spent bullets drop on the distended belly of the woman giving birth, for instance. Violence is certainly not intended to be realistic or even very plausible - the hero walks away unscathed from gun battles. There are plenty of spectacular stunts, such as a mid-air shoot-out before the combatants' parachutes open, and the fast pace of such material tends to lessen its impact. However, guns are typically used, especially by the hero, in wide circular sprays of bullets that are evidently intended to kill the maximum number of combatants. Fountains of blood burst from the heads and bodies of those hit, albeit briefly. A torture scene where the hero's thumbs and fingers are broken is realistically nasty. Some deaths go beyond the "one man against the odds" scenarios and become deliberate and callous executions.

Highly offensive language consisting mainly of the expletive "fuck" and its derivatives is fairly frequently heard. There is a likelihood of serious harm arising if children, in particular, emulate adult users of highly offensive language and thus attract social sanctions.

The availability of the publication is likely to be injurious to the public good unless it is restricted to adults. The feature is a black comedy that combines an implausible story with non-stop mayhem presented at breakneck speed. The body count is high. The material is full of the kind of gleefully mad and often tasteless humour that many viewers are likely to find offensive. However, in spite of the humorous treatment and the deconstructive effect of the behind-the-scenes material, the extent and degree of callous and bloody violence is such that children and young persons are likely to be disturbed by it. The presentation of such material for entertainment is also likely to desensitise young viewers to media portrayals of violence, with the associated risk of desensitisation to violent situations in real life. The sexual content, while not present to a great extent, includes some images associated with prostitution and others where sex and violence are juxtaposed. This material is intended for adult viewers and, along with the considerable amount of highly offensive language used, reinforces the conclusion that the availability of the publication requires a restriction to people who have reached the age of 18 years.
