This Official Information Act request is therefore about what forecasts or projections the Treasury has made or holds on asset prices over the next decade. Please provide me under the OIA all such forecasts or projections divided into various asset classes, such as "family homes," "rental properties," "shares on the NZX" etc, with which Treasury will use to provide advice to ministers on the likely revenue from various CGT proposals.

Information Publicly Available
