Please note as per my phone conversation to NZ police ph 04 381 0000, I was instructed by Mami (your police customer services person) yesterday (Monday 4th March, aprox 11:30am) to visit my local Tauranga police station to report this incident about how I was treated by officer A R Henry. I did visit the Central Tauranga Station (aprox 1:30pm) and spoke to a senior officer named Nick (sorry I cant remember his last name, but think it starts with L) about my situation. He also advised me to formalise this by following your complaints form process.

If possible, please provide the names and contact details of any other people who may be able to help us to resolve your

complaint. This may include witnesses or other people involved in the incident.

What Happened?

Please tell us about the Police actions you want to complain about.*

Police officer A R Henry pulled me over approx 3:40pm on Sunday afternoon, 3rd March 2019, on State highway 2, just before the township Maramaua. He advised me that through his sight he said I had been caught speeding whilst overtaking a vehicle on the passing lane a few kilometres prior to where he pulled me over. He said that this passing lane was now a 90km zone, and that I had been clocked travelling at 111km per hour whilst passing a car. I said that if this was so I was very sorry, but I was trying (along with several other vehicles) to pass a vehicle in a safe passing lane as this vehicle was travelling erratically and if I was indeed speeding it would of only momentarily been the case to safely pass before the end of the passing lane. Other cars were also doing this at the time. I also showed him a very clear GPS screen on my car which clearly lets me know what speed I should be travelling, as this part of the highway is all over the place with sometimes being 100km, then 90km, then 100km again, then 70km. I have to say one of the most confusing parts of our state highway for a driver to navigate. I was travelling with my daughter also, and would never put her in harms way. The officer didn't seem to care about what I had to say other than letting me know in a smug way that it is now a 90km passing lane and that through his sight he said he saw me driving to fast on the passing lane. I then said that to the best of my knowledge in my 44yrs I had never had a speeding ticket, and if I was speeding to pass the erratic driver in front of me, it would have only been momentarily to safely pass before the end of the passing lane. He didn't seem to care about anything I had to say and let me know in his abrupt manor that he had speeding tickets before, and that randomly he let me know we were the same age and in a smug voice that he didn't care about anything I had to say, and that he had heard it all in his 10 years or so. Due to the fact he randomly pulled me over several kms past the supposed infringement. I asked for him to show me evidence that it was indeed me that he had caught speeding. This was due to the fact that there were several cars trying to pass the erratic car on that passing lane. He replied that I needed to get out of my car and see his recording of supposedly my car speed of 111kms per hour on the passing

lane. By this time I was not feeling safe at all due to his manor towards me. I was travelling with my daughter and due to random (if feel inappropriate comments) and his rude derogatory manor towards me I did not want to leave my vehicle. I said to him several times that I did NOT feel safe and I did not want to leave my vehicle. Short of grabbing me, he made me feel like I had no choice and bullied me into having to leave my vehicle on this busy state highway 2. At a time where 100s of vehicle were driving past. I also did not want to leave my daughter alone in my car. After forcing me to get out of my vehicle to see the 111km screen he said he clocked me doing whilst passing on the passing lane, he continued his bully like behaviour and made me feel like I had to do what ever he said or else!!!! I had my daughter in the car, already upset due to his behaviour in front of my daughter towards me, and then he continued his bullying tactics. By this time I too was feeling soooooo very intimidated and just wanted this to be over. He asked for my phone number and home address, of which I withheld momentarily as I was feeling so bullied and intimidated and I didn't want him to have my personal details. He was a stocky larger build and I felt I better not say anything more. I did not want to put my daughter or myself at risk of this man. I did give him my home address and phone number and after he repeatedly pulled my drivers licence away from me each time I tried to get it back, he finally returned it to me and I then quickly walked back to my car. Thankfully my daughter had phoned my husband whilst this bullying was going on outside of my car, and stayed on the phone to him until I returned to my car. I was clearly very upset by this time and my husband said he would phone the police straight away and to just drive home safely and we would converse when I arrived home. My husband did call 111 straight after this happened to me, but the conversation he had and advise given was to just contact IPCA on Monday. I have never felt so unsafe in my life. I hope this never has to happen to another woman, and I never want this officer to ever be able to be patrolling roads on his own ever again!!! He is a controlling intimidating bully!!! I want to know that this man can never be anywhere near me or my family. I want to feel safe, and he made me feel anything but safe!!!! This is a very serious matter to me and I need to feel I will be taken seriously and be heard. I do not feel that this officer should ever be policing on his own. If he was able to make me feel the way I do over a simple traffic infringement, I hate to think how he would treat others for anything else.

Please note so far as per in writing above, my husband contacted 111 straight after this took place on Sunday. Yesterday I firstly called IPCA and spoke to a lady called Mihi about what I should do. She gave me the police phone number 04 381 0000. I then called that number and spoke to Mami around 11:30am about my complaint. From her advice I then went to Tauranga Central Station and spoke to I believe a senior Sargent named Nick around 1:30pm. He advised me to formalise what had happened to me and now this is what I am doing. Please see photos I took at the time of this incident and the last one is from google maps taken Aug 2018 where the passing lane clearly shows 100km zone. One has a photo of the officer in question and his patrol vehicle that day. One shows you what I see on my car nav system whilst driving. I do have other photos, but these are most relevant to my complaint.


